

A proposition is now on foot to build a ditch fifty feet wide through the Kankakee valley, under the Indiana State ditch law, and with the dirt removed build a railroad along the bank that shall extend from South Bend to Momence, Ill. This looks like a scheme to "Kill two birds with one stone." Drain that large tract of land that is now so nearly worthless and build a cheap railroad.

THE Mormons have held a convention,drafted a constitution and appointed a delegation to ask Congress to admit Utah into the Union as a State The usual way is to ask permission of Congress first and then attend to the preliminary law making afterwards. From the character of the Convention that sends up the delegation and of the instrument they bear there is no great probability that their plea will be granted.

The last rail of the Grand Rapids, Indiana and Mackinaw Railroad was laid at Mackinaw City, Tuesday afternoon, opening up another route to the Straits. The new road, which is vertually an extension of the Grand Rapids and Indiana, will be operated by them as a continuous line from Richmond, Ind., a distance of 455 miles. Trains will run through after July 2, making close connection with Detroit, Macinaw and Marquette for all points on the upper peninsula.

In a Grand Rapids family last week the authorities found a dead small-pox victim and two others very sick with the disease. They had been without medical treatment, were utterly destitute and had almost nothing to wear. -Evening News.

It was that of a man five feet four inches high and apparently about 35 years of age and had been in the water for several months. There were indications that the body had been anchored to the bottom for some time.-Evening News.

Two young men of Big Rapids, Gustave Rosenberg and W.S. Carpenter, were drowned while bathing in Muskegon river, June 23. They swam too near an eddy and were drawn in. Two others saved themselves by catching. on to logs. The next day three young men, while searching for the bodies, came very near meeting the same fate.

Tuesday Wm. Edwards ran against an iron heated to a white heat, which another workman had just taken out of a furnace and was turning around to place it on an anvil, in the ax foundery of Alf Dunton, in Hillsdale. The iron entered just below the collar bone, curved up and touched a large artery very near the heart. He bled to death. He was a young man, and leaves a wife and two infants.
