The fox trot is faster than the square walk and the horse will usually take a few steps at this gait when changing from a fast walk to a trot. The single-foot differs somewhat from the fox trot and has been described as exactly intermediate between the true trot and the true walk. Each foot appears to move independently of the other, with a sort of pit-a-pat, one-at-a-time motion, and it is a much faster gait than the fox trot. The rack is very nearly allied to the true pacing gait, the difference being that in the '4 ter the hind foot keeps exact time with the fore foot of the same side, making it what has been called a literal or one-side-at-a-time motion, while in the former the hind foot touches the ground slightly in advance of the fore foot on the same side. "So people say; but I wouldn't like to stand in either May's or Nell's shoes; that's all."


The Tichborne Case.

The main facts of the story are that Roger Tichborne was heir to a baronetcy and estate yielding \$100,000 a year. He entered the army, remained three years, and after visiting South America disappeared, and is supposed to have been lost at sea. His mother, proud and in-sane, was unwilling that the estate should fall into the hand of the child of a detested daughter-in-law, and accordingly advertised in Austrailia for the missing heir. Arthur Orton, a butcher and a low adventurer, immediately went to England, and, backed by speculators and accomplices, claimed the estate. The mother was an easy dupe, and though the claimant was wonderfully unlike Roger Tichbourne, the swindle progressed famously. The trial of the case occupied six years, and Orton was con-victed of being a perjurer and imposter. The case occupied thirty-one days in opening, forty-seven in summing up, the Chief Insting tools of being a perjure Chief Justice took eighteen days in delivering his charge, and the whole case cost over \$1,250,000. It is the most celebrated lawsuit on record.

The ancient custom of sending a present of fine cloth to certain high officers of State and gentlemen of her Majesty's household has lately been observed by a committee of the Court of Aldermen of London. The custom seems to have originated in a desire to encourage com-petition in the manufacture of fine goods.

Black Hills Mica Mines.

The McMackin mica mine was visited, and being the first one we ever saw, was examined with interest. It is found in reefs of white spar that resembles very much in appearance, at a distance, white quartz, but is very dissimilar. The mica lies in stratas, well defined, and all of them in the same more bring in the them in the same reef lying in the same direction, and from one to two feet in thickness. The mica in these ledges is found in sheets from one to four inches in thickness, and although in a vertical position, lie in every conceivable direc-tion, parallel with the ledge, at right angles to it and to all points of the compass, and this all occurs in a foot or two of the length of the formation. It comes out of the mine in pieces, of different sizes, the smaller predominating, and from the mine is carried to the cutting house, where the sheets are divided into about an eighth of an inch in thickness and then squared by a machine that resembles those used by tinners in cutting tin and sheet iron. After being cut the mica is weighed and carefully wrapped up in paper and tied with twine, one

Here is the weak point in fire insurance, contained in a nutshell: The willingness to issue a policy before a fire without protecting the company, and then trying to protect the company after the fire by harrassing the policy-holder. The time for a company to protect itself is before it issues a policy—the same as a merchant does before he sells a bill of goods. When a man applies for credit at any well-regulated store, his standing and reliability are looked after before credit is granted. So should it be in fire insurance. When a man desires a policy, his standing and responsibility should be known before a policy is granted, and the value of the goods insured fully understood to be enough to cover the face of the policy, the same as a collateral is expected to be large enough to cover the amount of a good loan. But in the unseemly competition to issue policies, risks are not carefully selected, and the result is that in case of a fire all claims are liable to be contested, in which event the innocent are generally the sufferers, while rogues and thieves are the gainers. - American Railroad Journal.
