Too Fat to Live.
John Heizer, the largest man in Milwaukee, who weighed 486 pounds shortly before his death, was buried at Forest Home Cemetery in this city. Heizer lived on the west side, and died yesterday morning at an early hour. He became so fleshy that he literally choked to death. The largest coffin in the city was procured, but it was too small, and the corpse had to be placed in a large, hastily constructed box. Decomposition set in so quick that the body had to be removed from his late residence to the cemetery a few hours after his death. Heizer was 50 years of age. When he was 16 years old he was very slender, and it was feared he would become consumptive. He was a blacksmith by trade, and was so large he had to be taken to his work in an express wagon for several months previous to his last illness. For some time past he could not lie down to sleep for fear of smothering, and would sleep sitting on a chair or sofa with his head resting on his bed.

Lively Dogs.
At the Brush Electric Light Station, at the corner of Notre Dame and Franklin streets, there is a dog trap which is somewhat remarkable, and the effect produced on prowling canines very peculiar.

A Colored Colony in Kansas.
The town of Dunlap, Morris county, N. C., settled by colored colonists, has met with remarkable prosperity. There are now between 275 and 300 families gathered there, and the colony is compelled to own his property, so there is neither land nor buildings for rent. Lots of land of various sizes, from 100 to 100 acres, are sold, and the terms of payment are so arranged that the new settler has four years in which to pay for land and improvements. About 175 families have each from 40 to 80 acres. A fine academy is in successful operation, a church is well filled on Sundays, and a public library is a popular evening attraction.

Centennial Bricks in Demand.
"Gimme a brick!" This question was propounded yesterday by a small boy of a newly married man who stood guard over a pile of bricks and stones which are all that remain to mark where the main building of the Centennial Exposition stood.
"What for?" was the laconic answer. "The man, after refusing the request, stated that there were at least fifty visitors to the ruins every day to see a brick." For awhile the owners of the pile of bricks and stones were content to let the boys break them, but when they saw how rapidly they were being taken over, they decided to put a watchman over them. The bricks have been taken off, decorated with the names of the owners, and are being sold at the Centennial building. The owner estimates that he is out just half a thousand bricks by the depredations of the relic hunters.—Philadelphia Record.

Meerschmum Statistics.
The place most productive of this mineral is known to be near the town of Beckersheim, in Nassau, Asia Minor. A recent account by Herr Adler states that the preparation of 100 boxes of meerschmum there takes twelve to fifteen persons two months, and costs about \$250. The average price of the average price has varied, since 1875, between about \$20 to \$30 (last year it was about the former). Refuse was can be had at about a eighth of the price. There are about 1500 boxes of the mineral in four sizes, there being 25 to 40 pieces of the first size per box, and 450 to 1,500 pieces of the fourth (the box is 10 inches long, 5 inches broad and 1 1/2 inches deep). In the last two decades the export of meerschmum has considerably increased; from 8,000 boxes in 1855 it has risen to 11,000 in 1881.
