Messrs. Arthur and George Stover of Berrien Springs were in town, Friday.

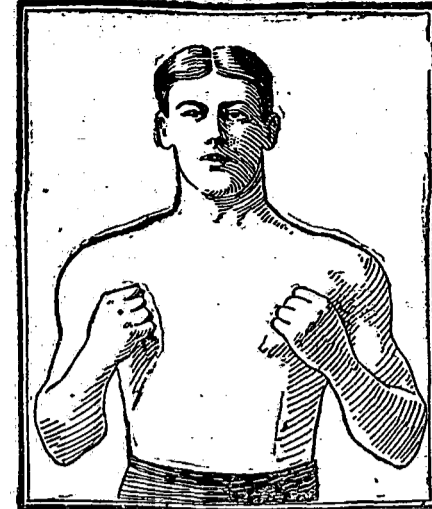
Alvin Godfrey, of Glendora was in town on business, Tuesday.

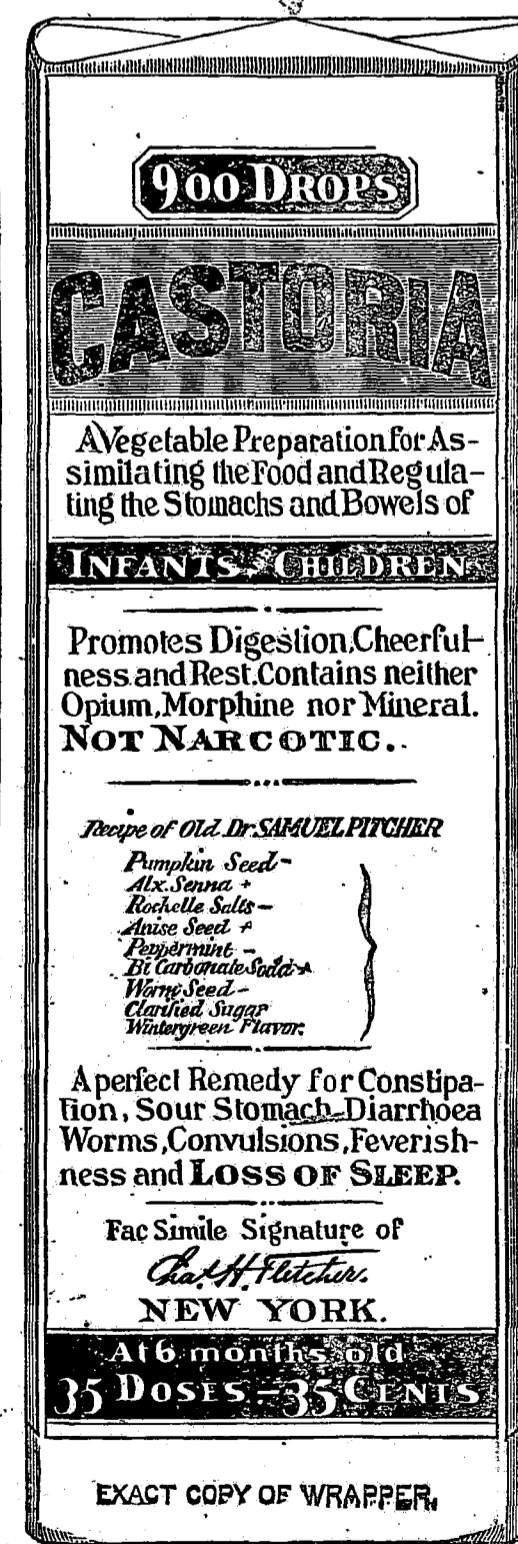
