BUCHANAN DISTRICT LIBRARY NOW OFFERS A LIBRARY OF THINGS!

Books, audiobooks, games, and movies are being joined by a wide variety of nontraditional library items for patrons to check out at the Buchanan District Library.

"This is a natural extension of what libraries already do, and will allow us to better meet the needs of our patrons," said Meg Paulette, library director. "A Library of Things is a way for our community to share resources and expand the boundaries of what a library usually offers."

The Library of Things will offer items such as tools, musical instruments, framed art, outdoor equipment, and more. Items are being added to the collection every week! Visit our website to suggest items for the LoT and to learn more about becoming an LoT patron.

The Library of Things is made possible in part by grant funds from the Michigan Gateway Community Foundation. The library actually received the first items for the Library of Things in March of 2020, right before the COVID-19 shutdown. Six ukuleles were donated to the library from Ohana Music in Long Beach, California.

"It was very exciting to get the ukuleles in the mail, and very hard to wait so long to make them available for checkout!" said Paulette. "Obviously the last few months changed many of our plans, but we're happy to be moving forward again."

Join the Buchanan District Library for a special program with South Bend-based author, Gabrielle Robinson. She will discuss her latest book, Api's Berlin Diaries: My Quest to Understand my Grandfather's Nazi Past, and talk about how you can capture your own family history through writing.

Gabrielle tells stories about people that reveal their personal situation within its historical context. One reason for her fascination with the intersection of the personal and historical stems from her own experience. Born in Berlin in 1942, her father's fighter plane was shot down in 1943. After her family was bombed out twice, they fled Berlin in 1945.

After her mother's death, Gabrielle Robinson found diaries her grandfather had kept while serving as a doctor in Berlin in 1945-only to discover that her beloved Api had been a Nazi. Moving and provocative, Api's Berlin Diaries offers a first hand and personal perspective on the far reaching aftershocks of the Third Reich and the author's own inconvenient past.
