The Buchanan District Library had a packed summer! Our annual summer reading program brought over 150 families to our library every week for story time and special lunch time programs including visits from exotic animals, Ronald McDonald, and City of Buchanan trucks and equipment. Area children logged over 2,000 hours reading this summer. Our adult readers read 526 books. Way to go!

On August 4th, district residents voted in favor of a 0.3 mill tax levy for the next 10 years for the library to use for operating expenses. This additional income has already allowed some great changes to take place here. The library is now open 9:00am-6:00pm on Mondays. As soon as a new, part-time employee is hired, the library will be open at 9:00am every day. This means more time for patrons to have access to the print collections, computers, and Wi-Fi.

The library has been able to increase the budget for new materials and more programming opportunities. We are lucky to now have a full-time Circulation Manager as well. The support for this election has ensured the library's ability to continue to serve this community and be responsive to its needs.

And lastly, you may have noticed our new logo and website. After many weeks

of upgrades and editing, the staff is excited about the website's new features and capabilities. With easier navigation and updated resources, we hope you will use our site to reserve and renew items, learn new technologies, conduct research, and play. There are still dedicated pages for homework help too. We invite you to take some time exploring and let us know your thoughts and suggestions.




