### School Electors Asked to Check Registration with City or Township

#### New School Plan Posted in Window Allen's Hardware

Exhibit Will Explain Use Of Funds From Proposed Bond Issue To Be Voted On November 13

All electors of Buchanan School District No. 1 Fractional are urged to make sure that they are registered as qualified electors with the clerk of the city or the township in which they reside. A new state law definitely disallows registration at the school for a school year.

THE DEADLINE FOR REGISTRATION FOR THE SPECIAL BOND ISSUE ELECTION IS 11 A. M., NOV. 13.

Qualified electors of School District No. 1, Fractional, of Buchanan City and parts of Buchanan and Niles townships will have an opportunity to see sketches and floor plans of the proposed alterations and additions to the high school building when they go on display in the main window at Allen's Hardware this week-end.

The drawings are part of a public information program designed to explain the propositions which will be presented at the special school election scheduled for November 13 at Room 4 in the high school building.

Plans call for eight classrooms to be added to the southwest wing of the present building. Primary and elementary grades now at the high school will occupy this wing.

The second major addition is a new gymnasium which will also house boys and girls locker rooms, and a 2,500 general purpose room.

Project alterations are as follows: the old gymnasium will be converted into a new and larger study hall and library. Room is also provided for library storage and a conference room.







#### Beef-Onion Pie

1/2 cup thinly sliced onion  
2 tablespoons water  
1/2 lb. lean ground beef  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
1/2 teaspoon pepper  
4 tablespoons flour

1 cup biscuit mix  
3 tablespoons Fat Milk  
2 tablespoons shortening  
3/4 cup Fat Milk  
2 teaspoons vinegar  
1 slightly beaten egg

Stir in with fork 3 tablesp. milk and water. Turn out on lightly floured board, knead a few seconds, or until smooth. Roll into a round large enough to fit bottom and sides of pan. Spread meat mixture over dough. Mix 3/4 cup milk and vinegar. Add egg and salt. Spoon milk mixture over top. Bake in moderate oven (375) 30 min., or until firm. Cut into wedges. Top each with a tablesp. of chili sauce. Makes 4 servings.

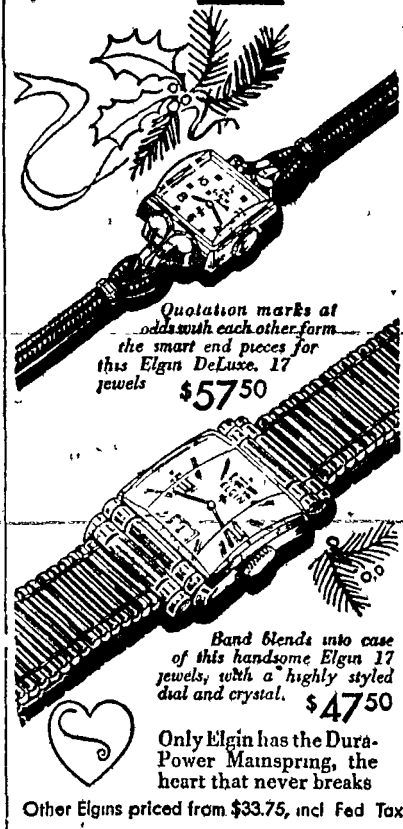
