## Buchanan baseball to depend on key players

Second-year Buchanan varsity baseball coach Todd Marazita is depending a lot on his seniors — especially since there are only four of them

"We have a great senior leadership from our three captains (Bill Carson, Ian Hall and CJ Remmo)," said Marazita. "They want to finish their baseball careers on a positive note, thus they have really pushed the underclassmen to work hard. As a team, we are improving daily. If the players continue to work as hard as they have thus far, we might be a decent team by districts."

The Bucks go into the 1994 season hurting from the loss of eight senior starters to graduation. Last year's team earned a 9-7 conference record, 16-18 overall.

"Inexperience is our biggest weakness," said the coach. "Defensively, we have a lot of holes to fill, starting with our pitching staff."

Key individuals are Hal, who should be a work-horse on the mound; Carson, who will fill several defensive roles; and Remmo, who

will supply power on offense

Rounding out the team are senior Noah Preissing, third base, shortstop, juniors Tom Desenberg, outfield; Bill Linn, outfield, catcher; Matt Payne, second base, and Ryan Gerkey, pitcher; sophomores Adam Prosser, second base, Matt Mattson,

pitcher, shortstop; Brian Paturalski, outfield, and Mike Bell, pitcher, first base, and freshmen Mike Cornelius, outfield, Jeremiah Vigansky, third base, Joe Marazita, pitcher, Brett Godsey, outfield, and Kirk Carson, pitcher, outfield

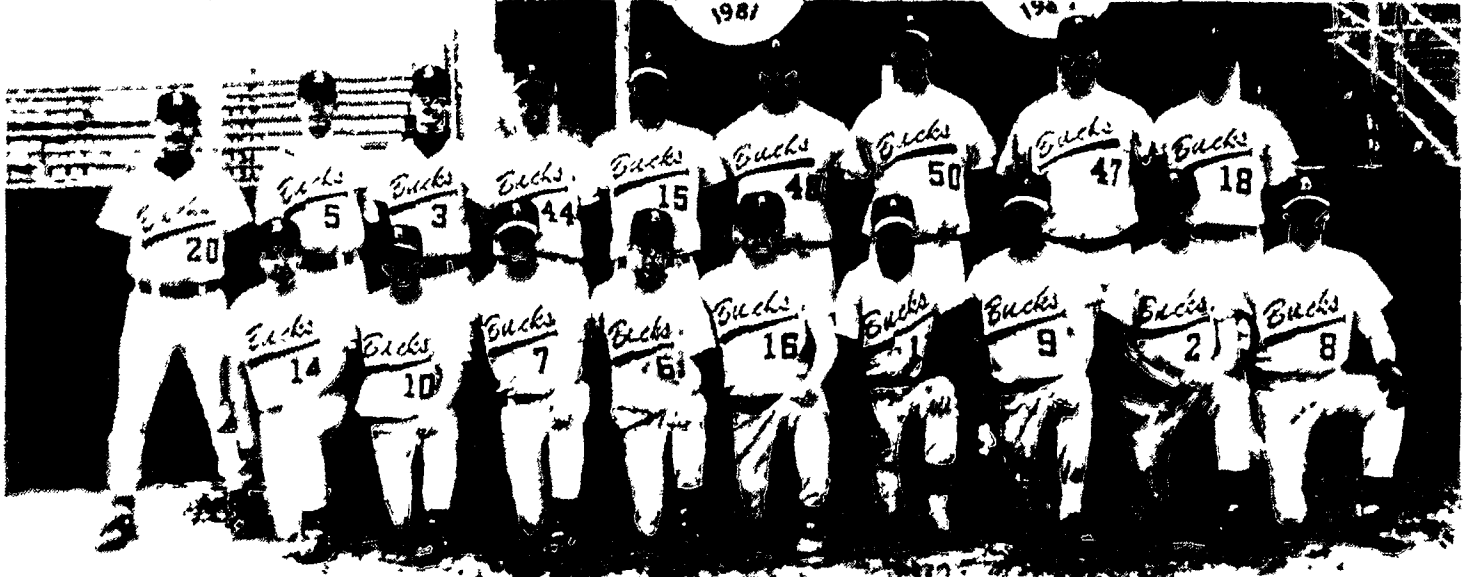
Marazita's first goal is to improve

## Bridgman baseball to be competitive this season

Spring is here and the Bridgman baseball teams are busy preparing for the 1994 season. The Bees' varsity

squad is under the direction of veteran coach Gary Owen, who returns for his 26th season as the varsity coach. In his years at Bridgman, Owen has a 296-252 career

record.

The Bees return seven players from last year's team, which finished 16-13 overall with a 7-5 league record.

Returning players are: Jamie Dyer,

a catcher-pitcher who batted .542 with 11 home runs and 43 RBI and was selected All-Conference, All-District, All-Regional and second team All-State in Class C last year,

Matt Gorske at first base, who batted .291; Jason Knowlton, second-pitcher, Joe Shingledecker, a pitcher-infielder, and Matt Arend, Chris Chaffee, and John Rodgers

Newcomer Shawn Binder will play center field while Chris Mendus will pitch and play infield and David Helfman will serve as an infielder.

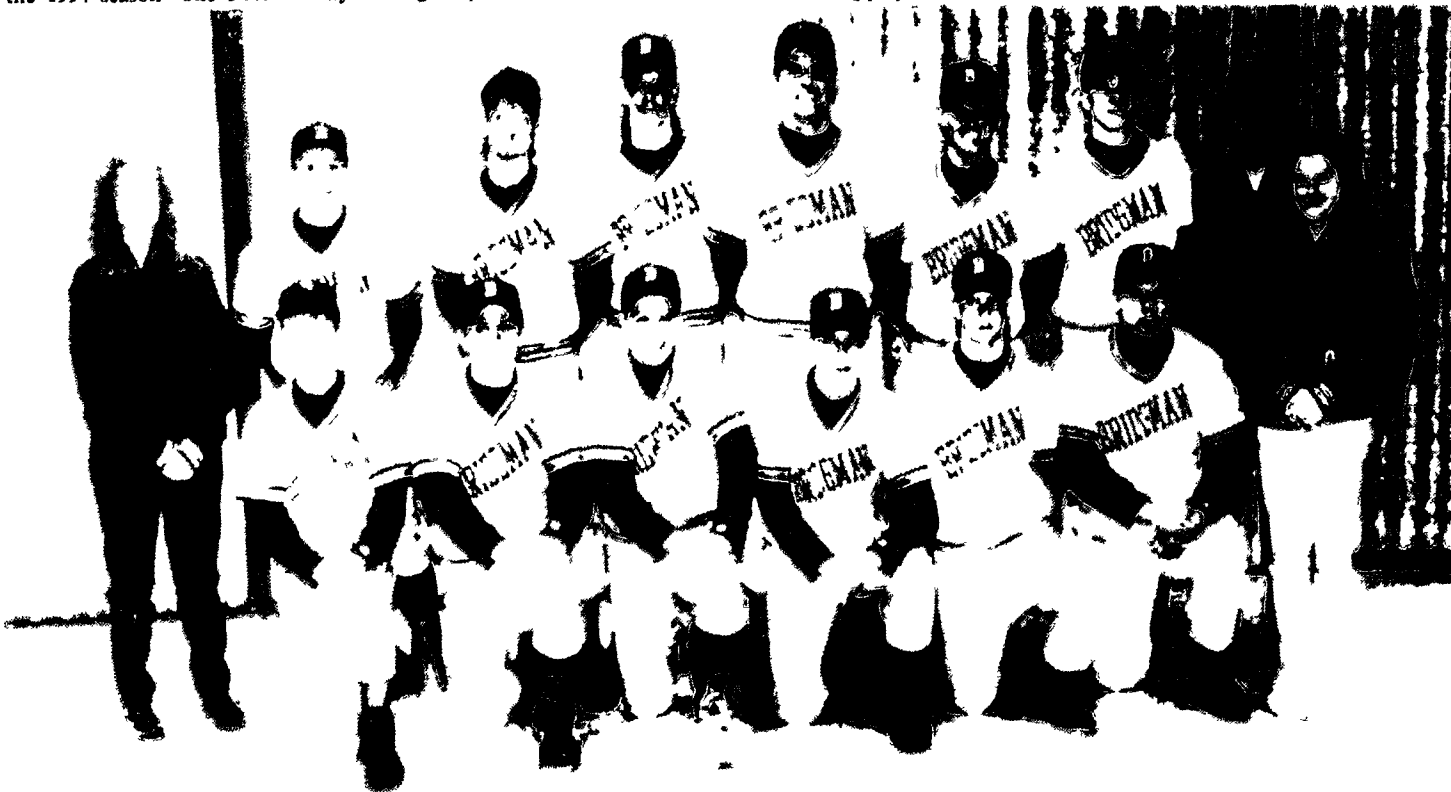
The Bees have four sophomores in Tony Hamann, Don Riggins, Chris Reimers and Corey Reimers. The four sophomores all pitch, as they are up from the 22-5 junior varsity team from last year.

"We expect to be competitive in the league and hope to challenge for the Class D districts and beyond," said Owen.

The coach also said the squad has very good team speed and has improved fielding at most positions. This should be a plus for his young, inexperienced team.

Pitching is a key for the Bees, along with the sophomores and juniors with little varsity playing experience.

A competitive schedule that includes St. Joseph, Lakeshore, Bradywine, Buchanan, Coloma, River Valley, Berrien Springs, and Edwardsburg should help the Bees in preparing for the Red Arrow Conference and the Class D tournament.

# Buchanan girls track team strong in most events

Coach Lisa McDonald believes her Buchanan girls track team is more well-rounded than in the past. She said her 21 girls are stronger in all events but the high jump and long jump.

However, the latter has been weak for the past three years since Letitia Bowen graduated.

McDonald has seven seniors this year and six are returning letter winners. They are Megan Smedley, a distance runner; Julie Slucas, shot put/discus; Erin McKean, distance; Katrina Morlock, distance; Andrea Kendall, shot put/discus; and Brandy Wightman, sprints, hurdles.

But McDonald said junior Dee Dee Cox, the team's leading sprinter, and sophomore Tanishia Brown, hurdles and middle distance, are important to the team's success.

In addition, she will also count on freshmen Dana Iler, who ran cross country; Becky Cangelosi, who has potential in distance; Tina Cox, a sprinter who is running on the No. 1 relay team, and Lynsi Wightman, who has potential in shot put/discus events.

McDonald said distance running is the team's strong suit with Smedley, who placed second at state in the 3200 and sophomore Melissa Laughhunn, who finished eighth at state in the same event.

She expects Lakeshore, Coloma, Cassopolis and Edwardsburg to be the teams to beat. "But we'll be competitive with them," she predicted.

Last year the girls team went 7-2 in

the Lakeland Conference and 9-2 overall. They placed third in the conference behind Lakeshore and Edwardsburg.

"I'm looking forward to a fun season as well as a learning one," said McDonald. "We'll do what we'll do."

accordingly This year he wants to finish on top of the Lakeland Conference To do this, the team must beat three teams it didn't do well against last year, when it ended

the season with a 2-7 record in conference play and 3-8 overall.

Still, the biggest difference from last year may be the Bucks' facilities Last season the track was torn up and

both boys' and girls' squads had to run around town and didn't have much opportunity to practice field events. Now the renovation is complete

"The training on the track has made a huge difference," said Minsker

Returning from last year's team are Tony Wakes, who is sprinting better than last year already, James and Jim Horrocks, who both run the mile and two-mile distance, and Dan and Jon Dodson, who along with the Horrocks brothers, make up the two-mile relay team

Steve and Randy Passig, Mark Weedon, Pat Young, Larry Ferris, Charles Landgrebe and Lorrington Bowen also return Young and James Horrocks are captains.

Minsker is also pleased with the younger team members. He said that although the new members have no formal track training, they have experience "They are making a difference right off the bat," he said

The 1994 Bucks have strong distance runners. This shows especially in the middle distance events Last year Minsker had only one middle distance runner compared to this year's 10 runners

Also improved are hurdles, shot put, sprinting and relays Even the high jump, which used to be weak, is stronger now with Seth Brown and Bowen.

"We're very solid," said Minsker "I'm really optimistic about this year."



# Lakeshore soccer will be difficult to beat

Lakeshore womens soccer coach Paul Carteaux is very optimistic about the upcoming season, but he has reason to be. He lost only two players to graduation last spring, Heather Subka, a sweeper who received an all-state honorable mention, and forward Kathy Pauls. But the best thing is that every player

on this year's roster has some varsity experience.

"The team is extremely balanced," said Carteaux. "In my opinion we're solid and deep at every position."

The depth showed during their first game earlier this month. Five people scored. Combine that with solid goalkeeping and defense and the Lancers will be tough to beat.

"They work hard at practice, they

pick up extremely quickly what we are teaching at practice — they're just that kind of a group. They're smart players. It's a tough combination to beat when you've got talented soccer players who are smart and willing to listen. It's fun to coach, they are really good kids."

A key player is goalkeeper Ann Koss, a junior who has started every year since she was a freshman. Other

leadership responsibilities will fall on this year's seniors Millie Schoenfelder, Jill Augustyn, Kyla Weber and Susan Behnke.

Carteau says he has mixed emotions about having such a strong team because the expectations are so high. Last year's squad went to the state finals in only the second year of the program.

"The expectations are obviously

high," he said. "You walk into that and try to keep perspective. The capabilities are there, but you also have to understand that a bounce here or a bounce there in a single elimination tournament can take you out of the playoffs. Winning's fun, but it's not the most important thing we're doing either."

Carteaux said the Lancers don't have many weaknesses, but he is trying to reestablish the team's key positions in terms of communications.

"Other than that, the soccer skills are outstanding. We have a lot of speed, good height and good stamina. If we can put all that together, they will be extremely successful again this year."

The Lancers will have to get through a tough schedule, however. They play mostly Class B teams except a few Class A all around this side of the state since there are not many girls soccer teams in the immediate area. He predicts that Gull Lake will be the team to beat. The Lancers defeated this team at regional finals last year 2-1 in overtime. Other tough teams will be Mattawan and St. Joseph with Paw Paw as the sleeper.

Carteaux is assisted by his wife, Lois, and Lakeshore graduate Heather Subka. This is his first year coaching the girls team; he coached the boys soccer program for six years.

"It's really a lot of fun. They're a real positive group. They're confident in their abilities. I'm really looking forward to the season," he said.



# Bee girls track to be conference contenders

The Bridgman girls track team will be coached by John Wismer, who enters his 21st year of coaching. The Bees hope to improve on last year's season as they finished 5-5 with a fifth place finish in the Red Arrow. Wismer will be assisted by Coach Phil Hull.

Bridgman has 21 girls out for track as the Bee coaches are excited about the team numbers and upcoming season.

The Bees will be returning 15 varsity letter winners from last year. Mary Schwerdt returns as the first place track honor roll holder in the 800 run with a time of 2:25.3 and the 1600 run with a time of 5:24.7. Rachel Wright finished fifth in the track honor roll last year and will return after overcoming a back injury. Other returning seniors include Becky Jacobs and Katie Pershell.

"Schwerdt should be among the state contenders this year. She certainly has the capability of making All-State," said Wismer.

The Bee coaches feel that the team should be strong in the 400, 800, 1600

and 3200 relay teams, as most of the teams return from last year. The sprinting events should be a team strength with returning runners.

The field events and hurdles could be a team weakness, depending on how quickly the younger girls improve.

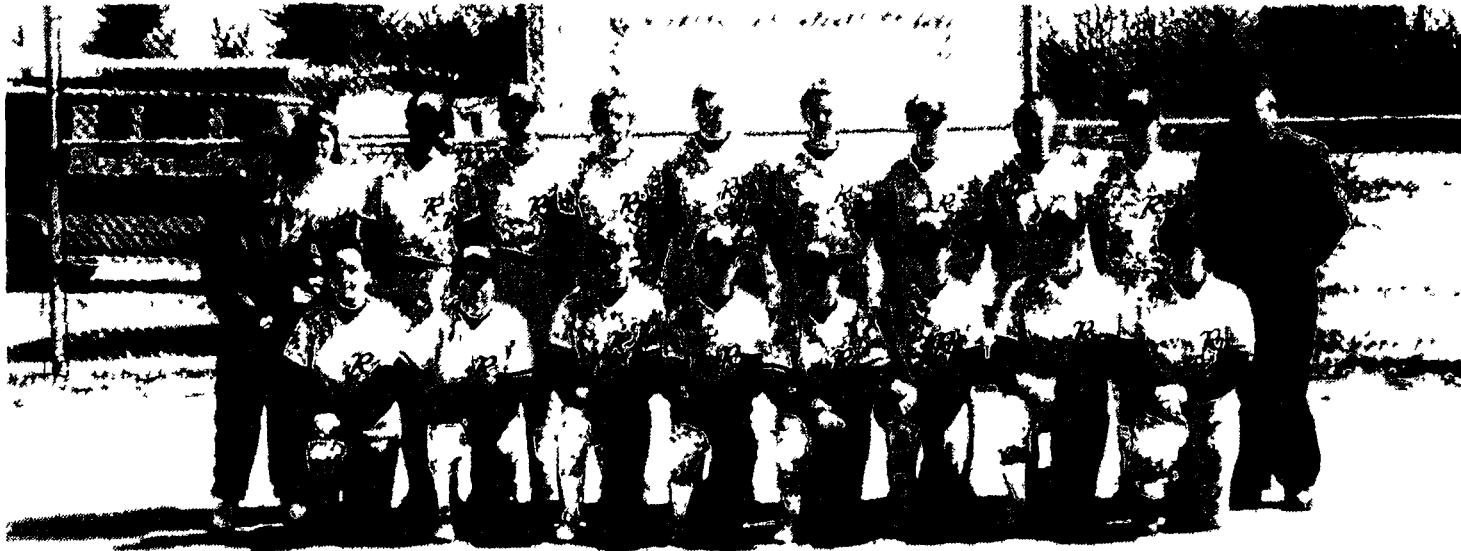

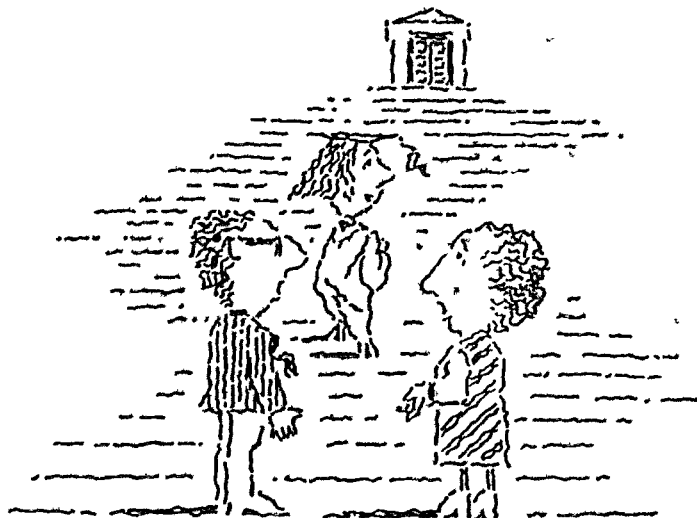



"I'm excited. A year or two from now we could be better than the sixth place finish from last year," said Bender.

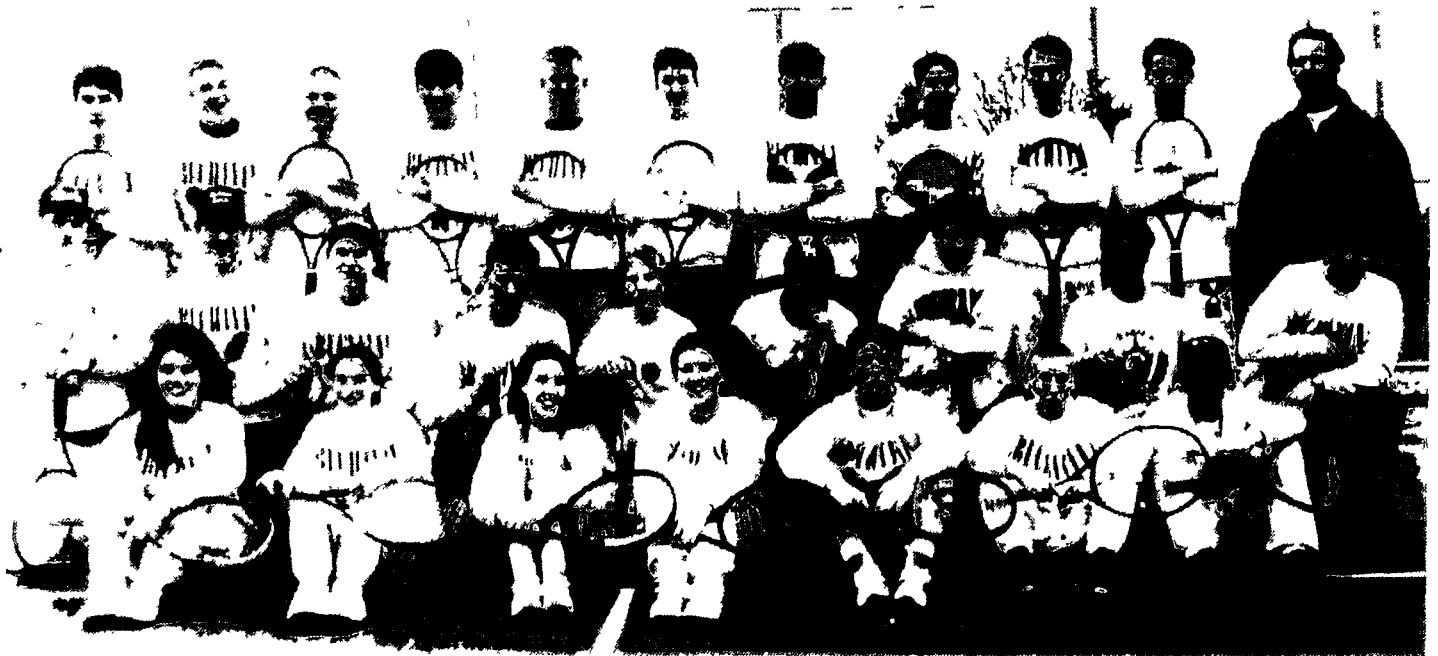

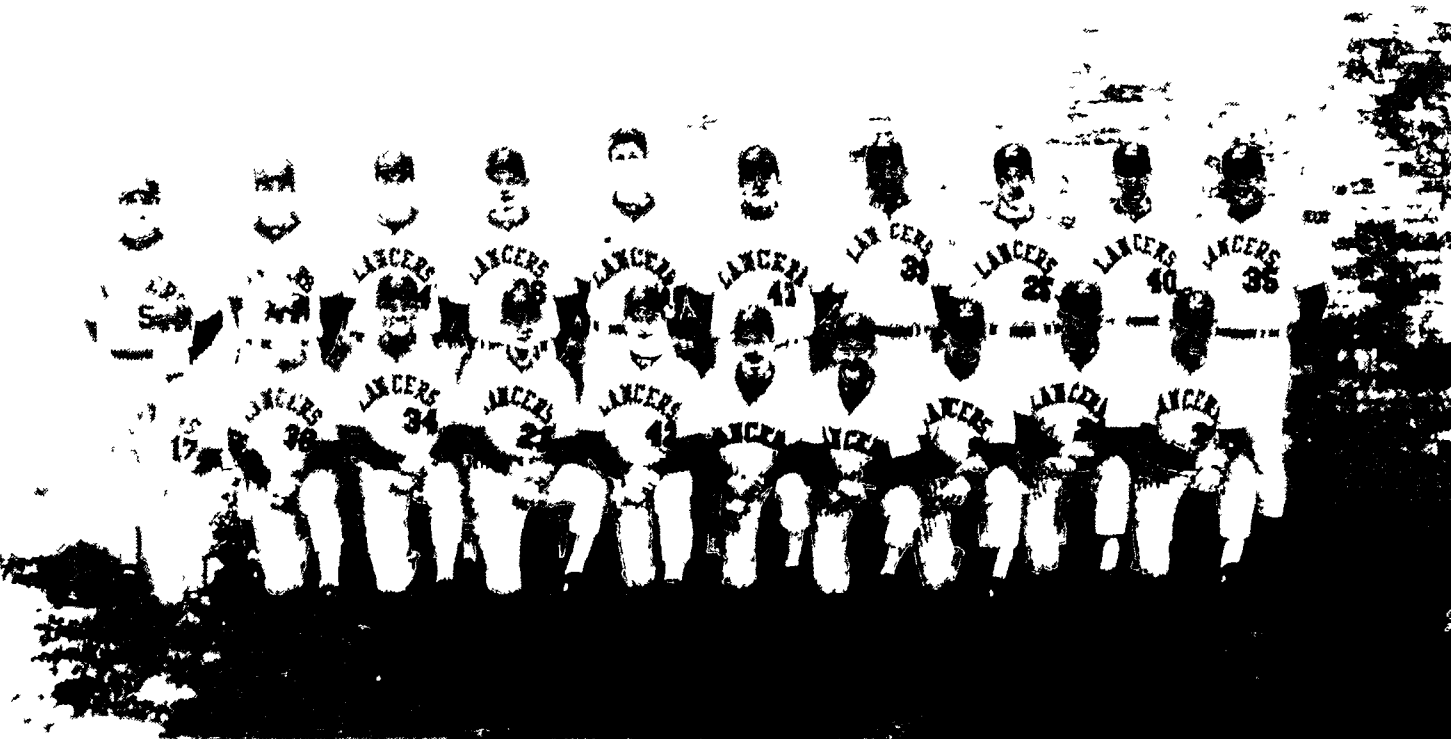
