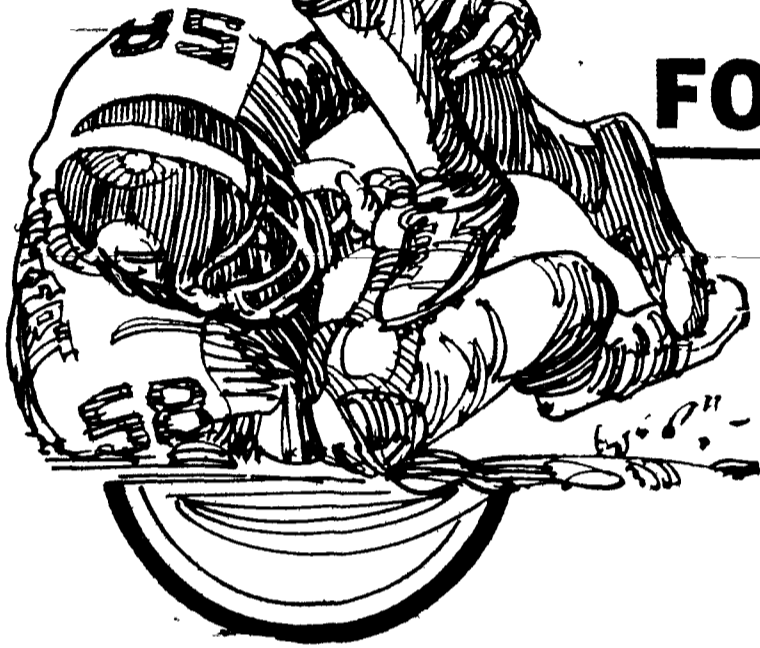

Bucks hope to improve record



Buchanan varsity football coach Mike Young (right) and assistants Jim Longcrier and Tom Wilcox will watch their team nervously from the sideline this season.

After their win last Friday, the Buchanan Bucks are hoping to end their football season with more wins and fewer losses than last year.

"I think we can improve our record," said Coach Mike Young. "We're going to be alright as long as we stay away from injuries." The Bucks finished at 6-3 last year.

Although the team is small in numbers (31), Young has 18 seniors returning to the squad who are "pretty quality kids."

Leading the offense will be quarterback Matt Remmo. The 6-3, 185 senior was the back-up quarterback last year, but broke his arm early in the season playing defense and never got a chance to call the offense. Backing up Remmo will be senior Tim Quick (5-8, 160). Quick was the starting quarterback last year, but lost the position because of a knee injury. Remmo's height and speed advantage gave him the edge for the starting position, Young said.

The coach sees the team's strengths as the overall defensive quickness, the depth of the offensive running backs and the kicking game.

"The defense is not very big, but I believe we are as quick as we've ever been," he said.

Young is especially pleased with his offensive backfield. "We're probably as deep there as we have been in years," he said.

In the fullback position will be either senior Eric White (6-4, 192) or junior Kelly Adams (5-9, 170). "Both kids will hit you," the coach said. Tailbacks are senior Tony Burns (5-7, 155) and junior Rick Hall (5-6, 145). "Both kids are quick, good runners."

On the field in the wingback position will be senior Joel Proud (5-9, 140), senior Perry Wahlstrom (5-8, 150) or junior Dan Vineyard (5-5, 130).

Field goal kicker Joel Proud was the team's leading scorer last year and Young hopes for his foot to play a big role in the team's success again this season. He kicked six field goals last year and was successful on 15 of 16 extra point attempts. Young called Proud a "weapon."

Young's best end is senior Eric Brown (6-0, 155). The coach said Brown is his best end for both blocking and pass-receiving. He will be used as a tight end on the strong side.

Other offensive ends are seniors Rex Allen (6-0, 155) and Steve Hicks (5-9, 165), and juniors Tracy Dodge (6-1, 162), Scott Boyle (5-11, 140) and Darrell Hyche (5-8,

142). Offensive tackles are seniors Mike Swam (5-11, 213), Eric Zelmer (6-3, 180) and Charlie Draper (5-11, 167), and juniors Dave Garcia (5-7, 160) and David Hughes (5-10, 180).

Offensive guards are seniors Tony Pike (5-8, 158), Pat Carrigan (5-10, 177) and David Stone (5-9, 167), and juniors Mark Pulliam (5-6, 140) and Steve Adolf (5-7, 158). Seniors Dewain Medlin (5-9, 158) and Brad Hemphill (5-9, 150), and junior Mike Balos (5-8, 140) are Young's candidates for center.

Punting chores will be handled by either Perry Wahlstrom or David Hughes, with Rex Allen serving as the long snapper.

Punt returners will be Wahlstrom, Adams, Hall and Brown, with tailbacks Burns and Hall returning the kickoffs.

Young said his teams only "glaring" weakness is in the offensive end position. Three good pass receivers, Andy Remmo, Tim Crouch and Ken Knowland, were lost to graduation last year, and Young calls Brown his only legitimate end. He's also worried about his overall team depth. "Our juniors have got to come out and challenge.. make themselves better football players," he said.

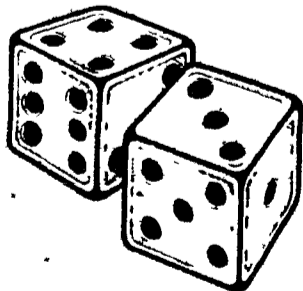

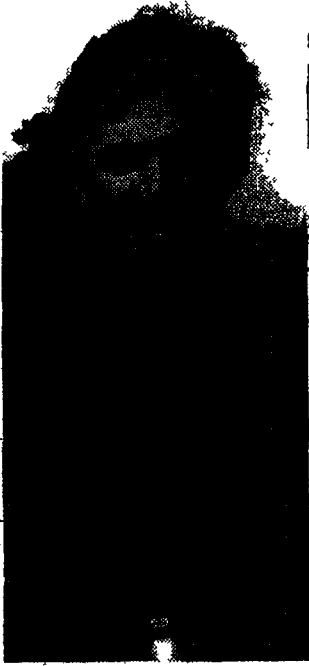

New coach has high hopes



Dennis Miller

After several years as an assistant football coach for various area high schools, Dennis Miller has finally gotten what he has always wanted — a head coaching position. And the new Galien mentor hopes he can put together a team that can improve on the Gaels' losing records of the last few years. "I was really happy with the group of athletes I found here," he said. "Coming into a new coaching situation, you tend to be leery of the talent. But (former coach) Ron Hart left me with a good core of

athletes. "I feel we can put 11 quality football players on the field at all times," he said. Miller said he will run a multiple-set offense. "In that offense, Vince Strefling is my key. He's my flanker," Miller said. "We've got to get the ball to him." Strefling is a 6-3, 180-pound senior. Returning to the quarterback position is senior David Legault (6-2,

175). Starting in the backfield are two seniors, Rick Chapman and Jeff Woodrick, with substitution coming from two sophomores, Tim Rohl and Larry Lamb. Junior Jerold Wojahn starts at split end and senior Bill Marsh is the team's center. Offensive guards are senior Matt Strefling (5-11, 198) and junior Aaron Schau (5-9, 165). Miller had praise for both of them. "I

think Matt Strefling will be one of the best guards in the conference," he said. "Aaron Schau probably fundamentally is one of the strongest linemen I've coached." Tackles are Ray Lorange (6-0, 215) and Pat Welsh (5-11, 175). Todd Canfield (6-1, 185) is the tight end. Assisting Miller on the sidelines are Chris Schau and Bob Schau. Bob Schau and Jim Legault are the junior varsity coaches.

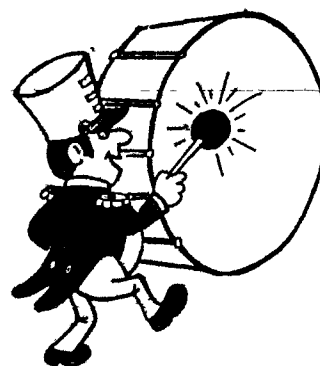

Bucks compete only in Red Division



Buchanan High School sports teams will compete in the Lakeland Conference Red Division this year, dropping out of the Blue Division

merge the two divisions if no new schools are added to the league by the 1985-86 school year.

The teams competed in both divisions last year, the first year of the conference division system. But at the time the divisions were set up, local school officials planned to drop the Blue after the first year.

The two divisions are currently dropped in sports in which seven or fewer schools field teams.

Only three other schools, Coloma, Dowagiac and Lakeshore, are in the Red Division. All are class B schools. The Lakeland Blue consists of five class C teams — Cassopolis, Brandywine, Edwardsburg, River Valley and Berrien Springs. Buchanan is also class C.

The division system began with the merger of the Lakeland and Blossomland conferences in 1982. The Lakeland was made up of current Blue Division schools and the Blossomland consisted of Red division schools. Buchanan competed in both conferences.

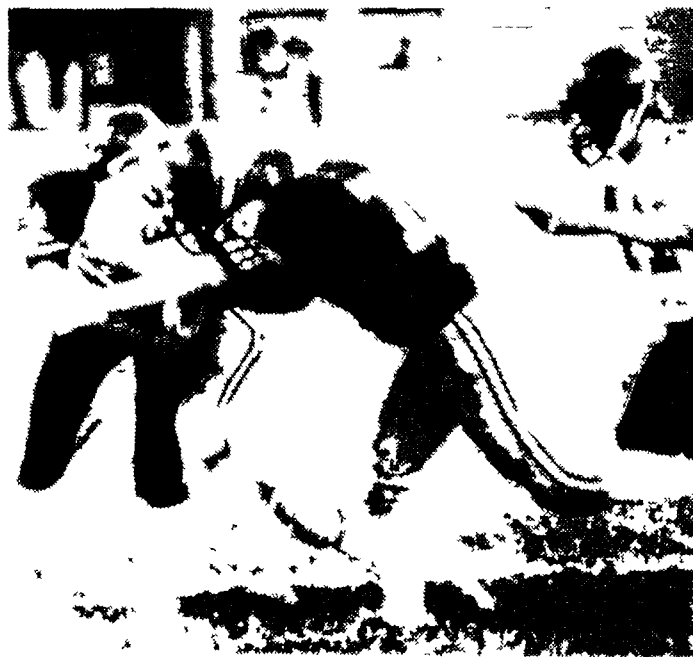
Buchanan administrators said they would rather be in a larger conference, but favored competing with the larger schools to maintain a high level of competition.

The old Blossomland Conference was made up of all the current Lakeland Conference teams, except Berrien Springs. The Blossomland split in 1980 when the smaller schools felt they were at an unfair advantage competing with larger schools for conference championships.

The superintendents of all nine Lakeland Conference schools have agreed to



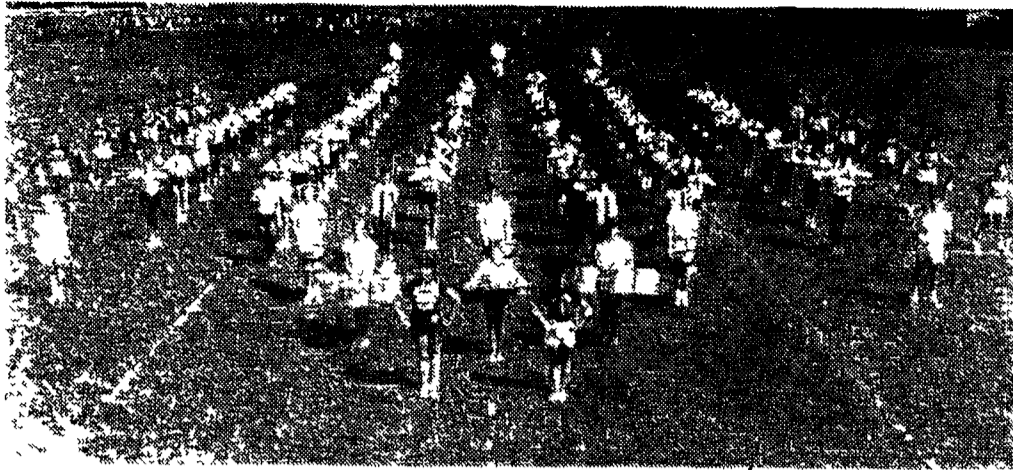

Girls off to slow start

The Buchanan girls basketball team is off to a slow start this season, losing their first three games. Coach Francis Brown blames opening season jitters and missed opportunities on the disappointing early season. Brown said the team has missed a lot of easy shots. "Our shooting has been

poor. We've had the shots, and that's the key to winning games — you have to score," he said. He said he's not getting scoring from key personnel. In the first two games, his starters have averaged around five points each per game. He hopes that some of those starters will become team leaders and pull the

rest of the team along with them. "That's what's needed with a young team — people to be more leaders," he said. "Talent-wise I think we're compatible with area teams," Brown said. "We're not being out-talented, we're being out-hustled." Brown has two returning

starters, seniors Dorothy Mottl and Carol Layher. They are his starting forwards. Juniors Tracy Carpenter and Jacqui Thompson both are letter winners. Carpenter is a starting guard, along with sophomore Deana Brady. Starting at center is senior Lisa Rauch, a transfer student from Niles.

Sophomores Kim Draper and Debbie Ehlert are back-up guards, senior Darleen Hill plays forward and Thompson will substitute as center. "We're going to strive to better our record (4-19 last year)," Brown said. "We've got to start working more as a team."

Westendorp, the varsity boys basketball coach who this year is coaching the girls team for the first time, said his main worry is his team's

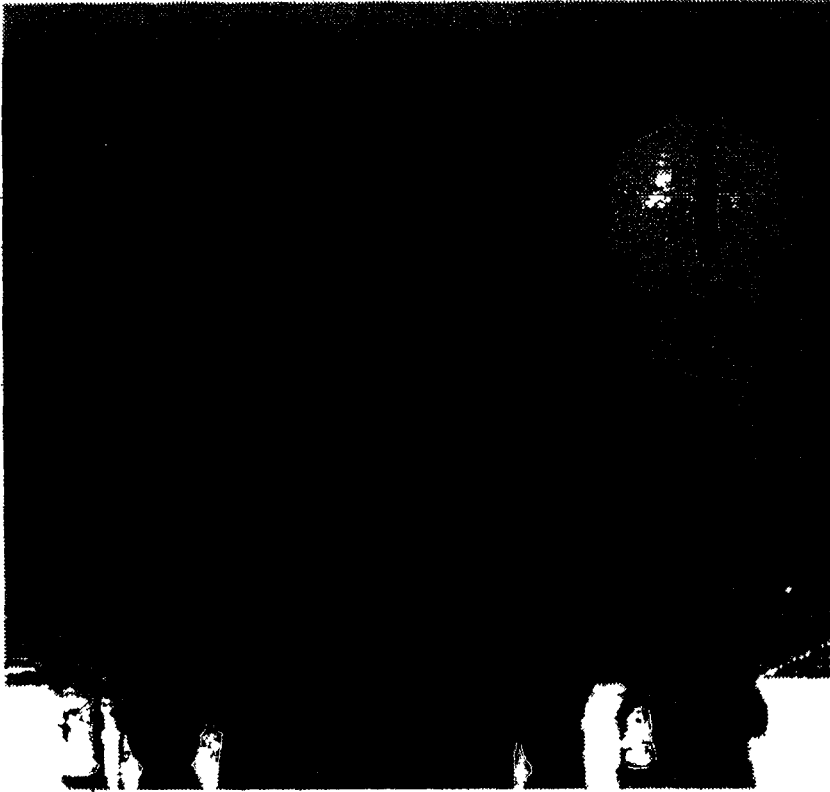
size. "We're not very tall, but we are pretty quick, especially up front," he said. "Our key is how well we shoot; our rebounding is skeptic."

# Young cc team lacks depth

"Is there life after practice?"

That's what Buchanan cross country coach Zell Stockwell tried to get his team members to ask during pre-season workouts. The coach said his runners must learn to pace themselves so their bodies will keep pushing throughout the 3.1 mile cross country races.

The training included distance running, sprinting and weight lifting. "It's one of the toughest sports there is," Stockwell said.

Stockwell said his team

lacks depth, but he feels good about his top runners. "Overall we'll be competitive," he said.

On the boys team, Stockwell is looking to junior Mark Sumerix for leadership. "He looks like he's going to be the race horse of the team," he said. "He has leadership and an aggressive method of running. He uses those two things to run a smart race."

John and Bill Eichelberger will also be important to the team, the coach said. "John (a

freshman) is a nationally ranked swimmer. There's no question about his ability. Bill could be an important leader to the team." Bill is the only senior on the team.

Junior Wade Cole will also be an asset to the team, Stockwell said. "He's been training all summer. He's got a good attitude and a very determined style of running — he gives it all he's got."

Sophomore George Miller and junior Mike Fisher are short distance runners. Stockwell hopes to convert

into good cross country runners.

The girls team is even younger than the boys, with no seniors and two freshmen on the squad.

Stockwell called junior Alice Gunn the "spark plug" of the team. The two freshmen, Sharon Wheatley and Diana Shelles, are "very promising." Wheatley holds the middle school half mile record and Shelles is the middle school mile record holder. "Both have outstanding credentials to run. Both could be

outstanding freshmen," the coach said.

Sophomore Beth Hickok and junior Torry Bohannon are promising, Stockwell said, "if we can get them to the point where they can endure the run." Sophomore Jenny White has a bad knee and her contribution to the team is uncertain, the coach said.

The team's first home meet is Thursday, Sept 15, beginning at 4:30 p.m.
