BHS Band Wins Second-Place In Marching Contest

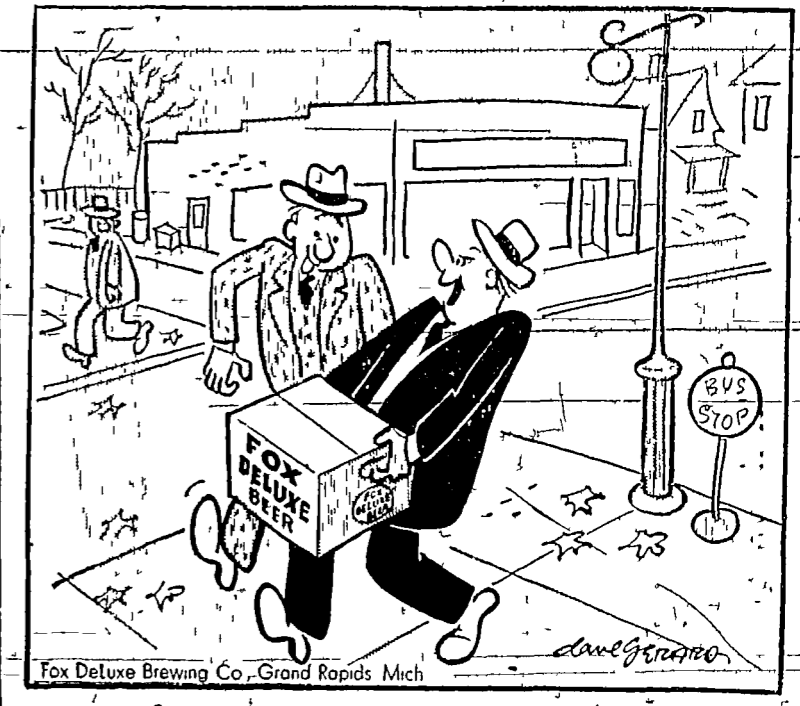
The Buchanan Band placed second in the marching division in the contest held Thursday, October 24, at the Elkhurst Field in Benton Harbor, Mich.
