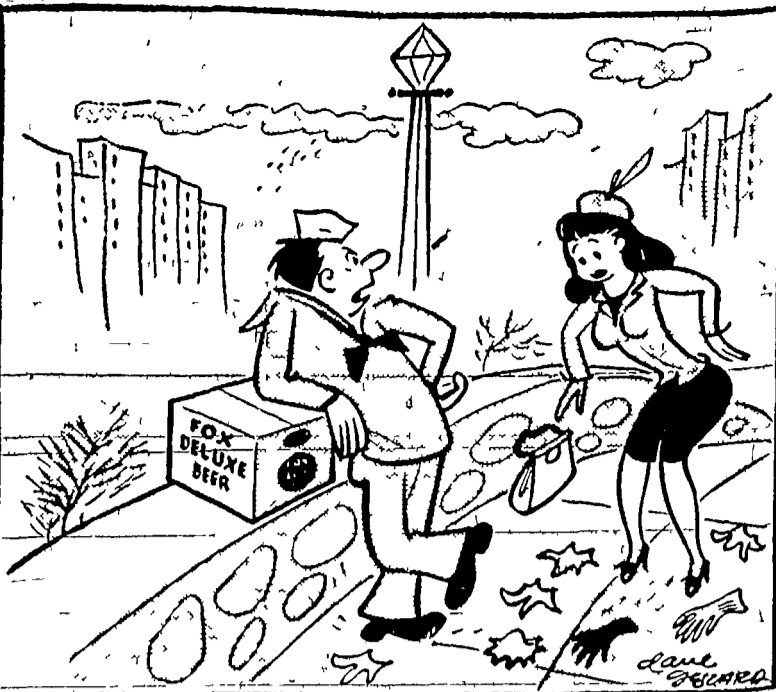

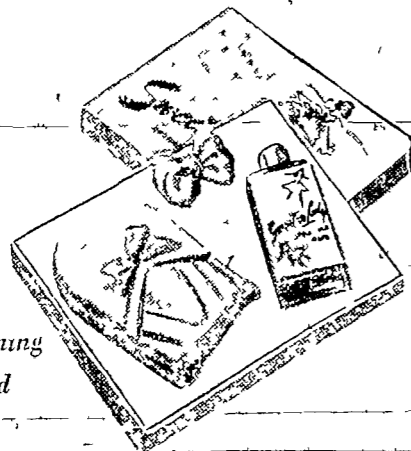

Carrie Dycus and son, William, left Saturday for a visit in Kentucky. Rumors are that Bill will get married while there. Until Bill says so, we won't believe it.

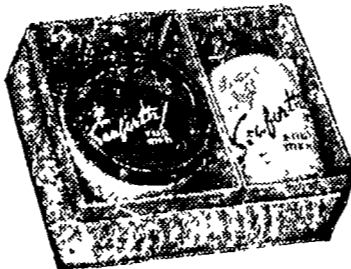
School sessions closed last Friday until the day after New Year's. The school received a check from Mr Otwell, as they have in past years, to use for Christmas gifts.

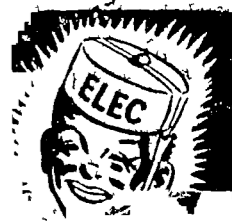

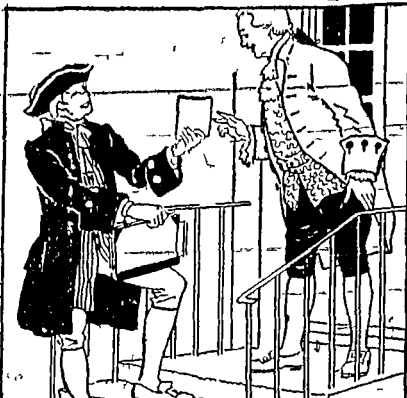
