Now there are about \$150.000.000 of gold in the country, and about 700,000,-000 of currency in circulation. The quantity of gold is probably sufficient, but it is not so utilized and distributed as to bear any relation whatever to the paper currency. Nearly \$100,600,000 of it lies in the Sub Treasury, a dead and idle heap, which, if it were part of the reserves of the National Banks, though their issue were increased to \$500,000, would give them as large a proportion of specie to notes as were ever held by our State banks in specie-paying times. The first point in the currency problem is to utilize the gold in the country by drawing it out of the Sub-Treasury and gold-gamblers' vaults, and distributing it among our banks as part of the basis and security of their paper currency, and the ever-available test of its value and medium of its redemption. This can only be done by first requiring the banks to keep up sufficient




