WAR AGAINST THE NEW DOMINION.

The news from the Red River country is anything but agreeable to the officials of the New Dominion of Canada. Some, too, who are not officials, become indignant at the conduct of the citizens of the Red River country.

What the people of British Columbia and the Red River country want, is independence, or annexation to the United States, which amounts to the same thing, as the U. S. govern people by allowing them to govern themselves.

As to the ability of Canada subduing the revolt, there is no probability. In fact, she cannot get to the Red River country with troops only through United States territory.

Third Annual Report of the County Superintendent of Common Schools.

OF THE COUNTY SUPERINTENDENT OF COMMON SCHOOLS, FOR THE YEAR ENDING OCTOBER, 1897. To the Honorable O. H. Foster, State Superintendent of Public Instruction.

It is a pleasure to me to report to you the progress in the educational work of Berrien county, we have now one hundred and forty-eight school districts.

Educational Matters.

Original and Selected. By H. A. Ford, County Superintendent.

What is Education? Education is the process of teaching, and the result of that process is knowledge.

Education is something more than the communication of knowledge. It includes the training of the sensibilities, and the forming and fixing of the character.

Education, mental and physical, is but the absorption of surrounding elements into the mind and body—an arrangement, an assimilation of materials so as to incorporate them into the being.

Education has reference to the whole man—the body, mind, and heart. Its object, when rightly conducted, is to make him a complete creature.

The duty, end and aim of education have been thus defined: The business of education is to educate or bring out that which is within, not merely to impart or impose a form from without.

The end of all education should be to promote man's happiness, not only during his present transitory existence, but throughout the eternity which is to follow.

Thus far the work of others, mainly—My own work may be classified thus: I am of the school.

A train of the Erie Railroad was blown up near Boston, Mass., on Thursday, Nov. 19th, and followed down an embankment a distance of 76 feet.

It is reported that the November statement of the public debt will show a reduction of \$10,000,000.

Reports from Indian Territory say that the Creek and Cherokee Indian Nations are very prosperous. Old fields are being sown, and the feeling in favor of union is increasing.

The Society of the Army of the Tennessee closed its annual reunion at Louisville, on Thursday evening, with a grand banquet.

Eighteen vessels were wrecked in a storm recently at the mouth of La Plata River, South America.

The State debt of North Carolina is nearly \$20,000,000. The Governor, in his message to the Legislature, opposes repudiation and favors the issue of bonds.

The Alabama Legislature assembled on Monday last at the instigation of the Governor.

A railroad collision occurred in Alameda County, California, on Sunday morning, the 14th, by which two passenger trains were demolished.

Investigations in New York show that the Government has been defrauded of \$2,000,000 by means of false income returns.

Thanksgiving Day was celebrated by American residents at Hanburg. The President of the Italian Chamber has sent in his resignation.

The Republican majority in Wisconsin at the recent election was about 9,000.
