Capital Punishment.

censuring the Detroit Post, and other papers of the State, for opposing what you call "the Bible-sustained punishment of the murderer." In support of your position, that the Bible sustains capital punishment, you quote the text, "Whoso sheddeth man's blood, by man shall his blood be shed." Gen, ix : 6, and, again, "All they that take the sword, shall perish with the sword," Matt. xxvi: 52.

But are you quite sure that these texts sustain the death penalty? That they are parallel in their sense, I have no doubt, but I do not see the reason for their use in sustaining the penalty of death for murder. I should rather view them as pro phetic. He who sheds the blood of his fellow-being, endangers his own life; for not only will a man defend himself, and even shed the blood of his assailant, but the same may be said of his family and near of kin. Those who fight and destroy each other, must expect to be consumed of each other.

The last of the above quoted texts could not be very strenuously used in favor of the death penalty, for it "All who take the sword," are to be punished literally, by being killed with the sword, what is to be come of our President and the hosts of others who have taken the sword and used the same with effect?

You will not interpret the above of our soldiers and officers, who used the sword in defense of their country. Well, are you sure it has any more reference to those who have committed murder? A disciple smote one whom he esteemed an enemy of the master and cut off his ear. If taking the sword subjects all who take it to the

death penalty, why did not our Savior here command that the penalty should be executed? Your interpretation of his language would seem to require as much.

But I am of the opinion that the text means only, that fighting and killing are founded on the law of revenge, which serves to bring the very thing on the one who would kill his fellow, that the shedder of blood himself practices.

I know not why we should go back to the practice of the death penalty. It is a barbarous form of punishment, if punishment it may be called, and is founded on revenge. It visits the acts of the offender upon himself. It is not a safe rule to practice. If I am reviled, shall I revile again? If another cheats me, shall I lower myself to his standard of life, and practice dishonesty toward him? If he deceives me, may I lie unto him? You can easily see, that this would be bad morality and worse religion.

The many murders that you complain of are not all committed in the State of Michigan. Indeed, I think you will find quite as many, and I will venture to say more, are committed in those States, where capital punishment is practiced. To set a cheap price on life, by the taking of it legally, is not the best way to protect it. " When they hung witches for the prac-

tice of witchcraft, did it prevent said practice? On the contrary, it seemed to have the opposite effect. One historian represented the result of the gallows, as a penalty for witchcraft, that "one-half of the people were witches, and the other bewitched." W. J. C.


