One thing, however, we think, Congress ought to do on its assembling, and that is, to so modify our National Banking law, as to allow of the establishment of new banks, on a gold basis. This will give banking facilities to the South, which, at this time is greatly in need of banking institutions.

INTEREST SYSTEM OF BUSINESS.

We notice a system of business is being adopted pretty extensively through the country, of requiring inthrough the country, of requiring in-terest on all accounts after a certain l er which the mind has of determining or length of time. The plan, at first sight, may seem a little severe, but on mature reflection no one can object to it. The business man sells his goods, which are his capital, at their cash value, at the time of sale. If, then, he has to wait for his pay six or twelve months, he is certainly entitled to his interest, as much as the man who lends his money. To make the matter plain, Mr. B. sells Mr. C. a hundred dollars worth of goods. These goods are worth a hundred dollars when they are bought by C., in cash. If, then, C. wishes time on them, is it unreasonable for him to pay interest? Not any more so than it would be, if he could not get the goods without the cash, and had to borrow \$100 to pay for them, and pay interest on the \$100 borrowed.

If B. sells C. the \$100 worth of goods and waits for his pay, he has to use another \$100 to replenish his 'stock less a reasonable profit on the sale. This money so used could be lent and interest received thereon, if C. had paid for his goods.

If a man sells his farm, he of course, expects interest on the amount unpaid; or if he sells a horse he requires the same. Then why is it not equally just for the business men to require interest on sales. It will not do to say he makes profit enough; for a farm may be bought for \$1,000.00 and sold for \$1,500.00, yet the seller wants his interest on what remains

unpaid. This system of charging interest on accounts, after a limited time, is approximating to the true system of business, the cash system-and will undoubtedly continue to gain favor, as its justness must, on reflection, be admitted by all.
