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BY-LAWS OF THE VILLAGE OF BUCHANAN.

The President and Trustees of the Village of Buchanan, in the County of Berrien and State of Michigan, Ordain and Establish the following By-Laws for said Village, this tenth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy:

BY-LAW XIV.

IN RELATION TO KEEPING STREETS AND SIDE-WALKS IN GOOD ORDER.

SEC. 1. It shall be the duty of the owner, occupant, or agent of each and every lot within the corporate limits of said village, to keep the sidewalk, and the grounds between the enclosure or outer line of said lot and the gutter, and also including the gutter, clear and free from weeds, chips and other rubbish, and to keep the sidewalk in good repair.

BY-LAW XV.

OF PLANTING AND SETTING SHADE TREES.

It shall not be lawful for any person to plant or set out, or cause to be planted or set out, any tree or trees on any street within the corporate limits of said village, excepting the same shall be planted or set out within such distance from the outer edge of the sidewalk as the President and Trustees shall ordain and establish.

BY-LAW XVI.

IN RELATION TO PUBLIC HEALTH, &c.

SEC. 1. A Board of Health, to consist of the President, Trustees, Marshal, and village physician, shall have authority to enforce the law of the State as provided in chapter 37, title 11 of the Compiled Laws of 1857, and the amendments thereto; and they shall cause the removal and abatement of all nuisances which in their opinion may be detrimental to the health of the citizens of said village.

BY-LAW XVII.

IN RELATION TO PUBLIC EXHIBITIONS AND SHOWS.

It shall not be lawful for any person or persons to exhibit publicly any show, or to perform publicly any plays, games, theatrical or other performances, or concerts, whatever, or to exhibit any natural or other curiosities within the corporate limits of said village, for which pay or compensation shall be required or demanded, of any kind, unless such person or persons shall have been previously licensed so to do by the Clerk or President, under a penalty of not less than five nor more than one hundred dollars for each and every offence.

BY-LAW XVIII.

IN RELATION TO GUN POWDER.

It shall not be lawful for any person or persons to have or keep, or suffer to be kept or deposited in any building or place within the corporate limits of said village, except in a magazine kept for that purpose, a greater quantity of gun powder than twenty-five pounds; and the same shall be kept in tin canisters with a secure tin cover, and not contain more than ten pounds of powder in each canister, and no such canister shall be opened after candle light.

BY-LAW XIX.

IN RELATION TO FIRE ARMS.

It shall not be lawful for any person or persons to carry any concealed fire-arms, slung-shot, or any deadly weapon, or any fire works whatever, within the corporate limits of said village, under a penalty of not exceeding ten dollars for each and every offence.

BY-LAW XXVII.

IN RELATION TO KEEPING HORSES IN THE STREETS.

It shall not be lawful for any person or persons to leave any horse kind in any street within the corporate limits of said village, unless such horse shall be securely fastened or hitched to some suitable hitching post or railing, under a penalty of not exceeding ten dollars for each and every such offence.

BY-LAW XXVIII.

IN RELATION TO AUCTIONEERS.

SEC. 1. No person shall exercise the business or trade of an auctioneer, or sell property at public auction, or outcry, without a license from the President of said village: this section shall not apply to any person selling property by virtue of a legal process or under a mortgage.

BY-LAW XXIX.

ON SPORES.

It shall not be lawful for any person to fly any kite or play with any game of ball or any sport with a ball, on any main or front streets in said village, under a penalty of not more than one dollar for each and every offence.

BY-LAW XXX.

IN RELATION TO CORPORATE PROPERTY AND PUBLIC PLACES.

It shall not be lawful for any person to write upon, mark, nail, deface, or injure in any manner, or to injure or trespass upon, any corporate or private property or public place belonging to said village, under a penalty of not exceeding one hundred dollars for each and every such offence.

BY-LAW XXXI.

IN RELATION TO SPIRITUOUS OR FERMENTED LIQUORS.

SEC. 1. It shall not be lawful for any person or persons to sell or give away, at any time, or to cause or permit to be sold or given away to any drunkard, minor, or apprentice any spirituous or fermented liquors within the corporate limits of said village, under a penalty of five dollars and costs of prosecution for each and every such offence.

BY-LAW XXXII.

ON BURIALS.

SEC. 1. All persons before making interments in the burying ground, shall apply to the Sexton of the Corporation, who shall select the place of making such interment. The said Sexton shall be the only person allowed to dig graves, for which services he is authorized to receive two dollars for digging the grave and attend the burial of a person of ten years of age and upwards, and one dollar and twenty-five cents for one under ten years of age.

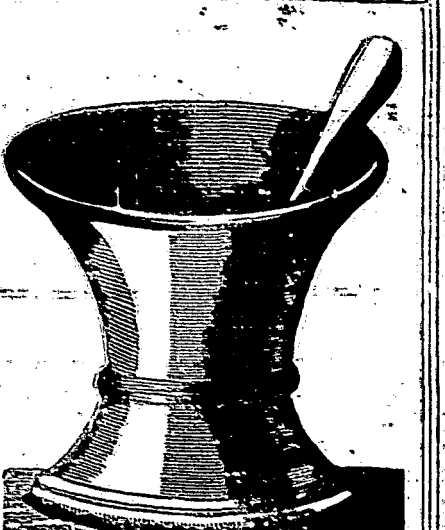
