CANADA AND THE FENIANS.

For the past few days unusual activity has been going on all over the country among the Fenians. It was reported that on Monday over 20,000 Fenians left Brooklyn for Canada. This, no doubt, is an exaggerated statement, but that large numbers left that city for some point is doubtless true. The dispatches from Burlington, from Buffalo, Erie, Cincinnati and New York show that the Femians are moving. Large numbers are congregating in Buffalo and Vermont along the frontier.

The Canadian movement against the Red River country gives a fine opportunity for Fenian operations, and we have no doubt but they will take advantage of the situation. At least if they do not do so, there is less wisdom among them than we have credited them with.

That the indications are that the Fenians mean business looks very probable, when it is known that the U. S. steamer went to Buffalo to watch their movements. While there is so much activity among the Fenians the Canadians are in a perfect state of excitement. This state of affairs is anything but pleasant for our Can-adian neighbors, but it is surely nothing more than a just retribution for the treatment Canada accorded the North during the days of the rebellion. It is not in our heart to tender much pity or consolation to our neighbors across the border, when we re-member how they taunted the Union cause during the dark days of the war.

While we do not approve of one nation countenancing the fitting out of expeditions, on her own soil, against another nation with which she is at peace, we can heartily wish that our Government would not be too vigilant against the Fenian-Canadian ex-peditions. This is especially the case, if Canada persists in her Red River expedition. We wait the developments, and shall expect, ere long, to know more of the operations of the Fenians.

Let the instruction be progressive-at first pertaining mainly to mechanical, then to intellectual, and lastly to emotional reading. Ask frequent questions, in review. Obedience to these sugges-

tions will ensure pretty thorough teaching, that will give the pupil welldefined ideas. 7. Keep all the class engaged upon the lesson or the drill. Don't have them read "in order." Let each be ready to answer a call to read at any time. They should read in concert

sometimes, look for mistakes, name points of punctuation or their uses, capital and italic letters, etc. For variety's sake, they may each read a single line, or to a point, or a word at a time. It is rare that a pupil can do full justice to a whole verse, at first trial. Many other methods of keep-

be devised. 8. Go no further in the reader at each recitation than you can teach well. A . "lesson" there is designed to be sufficient for a lesson, and can seldom be exceeded to advantage. It oftener happens that less should be taken.

9. Give especial attention to the beginners. The first steps in reading, or in any other branch, are all-important. They often determine the success or failure of the man.


