THE ELECTIONS.

Further returns of the late elections confirm the dispatches published in our last issue, except as to Indiana. That State has doubtless gone Democratic by about 2,000 majority.

In Ohio the Congressional delegation stands as it does at present, 14 Republicans to 5 Democrats. Schenck is defeated by 44 votes. Campbell's, his opponent, election will be contested. The Republican majority in the State is greater than it was two years ago.

THE PROSPECTS. Again the prospects for an early peace in the Franco-Prussian war appear to brighten. Prussia is evidently willing to accede somewhat from her former demands for peace.
