

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS.

At the coming election to be held on Friday, Nov. Sth, the people will be called upon to vote on four proposed Constitutional Amendments. 1st. Striking the word "white" out of the constitution wherever it occurs. Those in favor of this amendment are to vote a ballot bearing these words, "Amendments as to Impartial Suffrage -Yes," and those opposed, "Amend-ments as to Impartial Suffrage-No." The second Amendment looks to the authorizing of County Boards of Supervisors to raise \$2,000, in one year, by tax for building, repairing, bublic roads, bridges, &c. This Amendment reads as follows : "ARTICLE X.

"SEC. 9. The Board of Supervisors of any ounty may borrow or raise by tax Two Thouand dollars for constructing or repairing pubic buildings, highways or bridges; but no reater sum shall be borrowed or raised by tax or such purpose in any one year, unless authored by a majority of the electors of such counv voting thereon."

Those who favor this Amendment vill vote ballots with these words theren. "Amendment relative to raising 2,000 for public buildings, highways r bridges-Yes." Those opposing he Amendment will vote a like ballot xcept the word yes is to be substitued by the word No.

3d. An Amendment relating to the alaries of State officers and Circuit udges. This Amendment reads as bllows:




