STATE ELECTION.

The result of the election in the State, so far as returns have been received, indicates the election of the Republican ticket by about 25,000 majority. A light vote has been polled in almost every locality. In the State at large, perhaps there has not been a three-fourths of a vote polled.

In the First Congressional District Henry Waldron, Republican, is un-doubtedly elected by a 1,000 to 1,-

200 majority. The Second District will give Gen. Stoughton probably 3,500 majority. In many localities Mr. Stoughton ran badly behind the ticket.

The Third District will give Austin Blair some 2,000 majority. In the Fourth District Mr. Ferry

will receive not less than 10,000 majority. Mr. Ferry is a very popular man, and has served that District so faithfully that his majority will be large.

The Fifth District will return Mr. Conger by a reduced majority. There is no doubt of his election, but his majority will not be large, perhaps 500.

In the Sixth District, Judge Sutherland, Democrat, is undoubtedly clected over Driggs, the Republican. This result should teach the Republicans, not only of that District, but of every other one, the danger of nominating a man unpopular with the masses of the people. It will be re-membered that in the Sixth District, Strickland, the present member, desired a renomination, and that Driggs and his friends were determined to defeat Strickland's nomination. Driggs and his friends, however, beat Strickland in the Convention, after balloting over forty times. There had been so much feeling gotten up between the candidates and their friends, that it was wholly impolitic to nominate either. Wisdom surely would have dictated the laying sside of both Driggs and Strickland, and then nominating some other man on whom the elements of discord could have united. Had this been done, our delegation in Congress would again have been unanimously Republican, but as it is, the Republicans will have two Senators and five out of the six Representatives in Congress.

The next State Legislature will stand in the Senate about 24 Republicans to 8 Democrats, and in the House about 67 Republicans to 33 Democrats. This will do well enough.

# ELECTIONS IN OTHER STATES.

The election in New York City passed of very quietly, with large Republican gains. In the State, the Democrats seemed to have gained somewhat. The Democratic majority, claimed for the State is from 30.000 to 40,000. Greeley is defeated for Congress by about 1,000. Hoffman is elected Governor. The Legislature will be Democratic.

Massachusetts has gone Bepublican by a larger majority than it did last year. All the Republican Congressmen are elected, and the Legislature The New Yoters.


