HON. T. W. FERRY.

We clip the following notice of Mr. Ferry's election to Congress, from the Grand Army Journal of the 19th, published at Washington. It shows how Mr. Ferry is estimated in the Capital, during the time he has been in Congress.

EDORA, IOWA, Nov. 26, 1870. DEAR RECORD: I am now safely housed with my family in Eldora, Iowa, and as many of my friends desired me to give them some information in regard to this part of the country, I avail myself of this opportunity to sketch a few items.

The visitation of the schools by educational officers and the people has decidedly improved. The number of Directors' visits for the year is 401, against 320 last year.

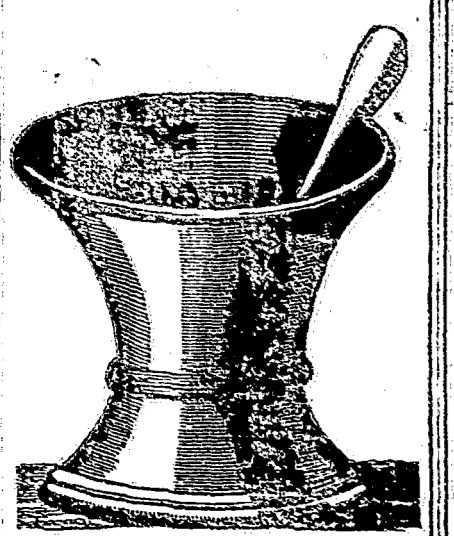
