This will be the case if only teachers, instructors and superintendents are consulted in framing the planupon which to operate. Their ideas only take in one view of the situation. They only look on one side of the question. They see only the best plan to educate the child irrespective of any other consid-

eration. They forget that parents have any rights which they are bound to respect.

These extreme compulsory educationists would take the child almost wholly from the parents' control and place it under the teacher. This might work in the German Empire, but it would never work in free Republican America.

tic to advocate these extreme measures, and can only result in harm to the furtherance of the cause of general education. Let some moderate plan be adopted, requiring children of school age, say from seven to twelve years, to attend school during a certain por-tion of each year. Perhaps three months, or four at the outside, would be sufficient to secure so much education to each child, as would enable it to transact understandingly all the common business affairs of life. To carry the compulsory system further than this would, doubtless, meet with so great opposition as to render the attempt a perfect failure. To carry it thus far would be just to the chil-dren and parents of the State, and would undoubtedly be sustained by the public sentiment of the great mass of the people. To our mind wisdom says, be not too hasty—rush not head-long into measures that the people will not sustain. Let it be remembered that a few conceited, self-important, self-constituted educators do not always represent the people, and that the people constitute the power behind the throne in Republican America.

FRANCE AND HER PROSPECTS.

The situation of France to-day, so recently one of the first powers of Europe, is indeed deplorable. The prospects for a future of prosperity is gloomy enough. The German armies are not now, we imagine, the worst foe of France. Internal discussions and strife loom up in the near future. Open hostility seems immiment between the Paris government and the Bordeaux division.

The Paris government seems disposposed to allow the entire people to express themselves untrammeled in the election of a National Assemby. And if the people choose to elect candidates favorable to an empire or republic all is well, This is as it should be. This is allowing the governed to choose the form of government. On the other hand Gambetta and the authorities at Bordeeux have issued their decree forbidding the people to elect any person to the constituent assembly that is connected with any of the reigning families of France since 1789. They also prescribe other restrictions, which are in open hostility to the Paris authorities.

The Bordeaux government, with Gambetta at its head, desire to rule France. They will not even allow the people to vote for peace if they can prevent it. Favre and Thiers are equally ambitious to lead in France, but are more wise and cautious. The idea acted upon seems to have been that the legislators meet to pass laws, and it made no difference what they did, just so they acted, passing, often without any discrimination, voluminous laws that were unreconcilable with existing laws, and wholly unnecessary.

The work of re-compilation will require great care, knowledge and skill, and we wait with impatience for its completion, feeling that we shall then be able to know, with more certainty, what laws are now in force throughout our State.

Salaries.

EDITORS BERRIEN COUNTY RECORD: -Among the questions being discussed by the press of the State I notice that the question of "Increase of Salaries," especially the salaries of our Supreme and Circuit Judges, is receiving a fair share of attention. Will you allow an "humble individual," to offer a few thoughts on the subject of salaries through your columns?

When the Republican party went before the people and asked for their

suffrage at the last Presidential election, it was with the promise and assurance that retrenchment, reform and economy should be carried into every department of the government, and that instead of an increase of expenditures and salaries, that our expenses should be diminished, useless offices and officers abolished and taxes reduced. Again, last fall, we went before the people of our State making substantially the same promises and

pledges. I believed what I told the people and supposed that our editors did the same. But now, after the election is over and the people have again taken us at our word and entrusted us with a new lease of power, I find the editors pretty generally going back on their record and advocating an increase of salaries, and, per consequence, an increase of taxes. Several resolutions have been introduced into the legislature asking the Judiciary committee to enquire into the propriety of submitting an amendment to the Constitution on the subject of salaries, as though this was a matter the "dear people" had not already settled, as they supposed, irre-

vocably.

You and I know, Mr. Editors, that one of the reasons the new Constitution was voted down was because it contained this very proposition, and I found more men who voted against its adoption on this than any other one

Mr. Beaman presented a joint resolution of the Michigan Legislature for the repair and improvement of the harbor and ship canal at Monroe, Michigan. The bill passed which provides that all honorably discharged soldiers and sailors, who served in the late rebellion ninety days, their widows and orphan children, can

acquire homesteads on the public lands of the United States, or if discharged on account of wounds received or disabilities incurred in the line of duty, their term of enlistment shall be deducted from the time heretofore required to perfect a title. In case of the death of any person who would be entitled to a homestead under the provision of the first section of this act, his widow, if unmarried, or in case of her death or marriage, then minor orphan children shall be entitled to all the benefits enumerated. The act provides that if such person died during the term of his enlistment, the whole term of enlistment shall be deducted from the time heretofore required to perfect a title. Every private soldier and every seaman, marine and

officer, who served ninety days, and all now inscribed on the pension rolls, are entitled to the benefits of the act.- The Committee on Appropriations reported a bill appropriating \$15,-000 for the expenses of the investigating committee and the House passed it.

SENATE-FEB. 1ST.

Mr. Buckingham presented a remonstrance from women of New England against female suffrage. Mr. Pomeroy offered the following: That in obedience to that Christian charity which seeketh good for all nations and minis ters to all human distresses, we heartily commend the suffering beligerent nations in Europe to the American people, and recommend that a generous system of organized , charity, seeking out and providing first for their most pressing necessities, be speedily inaugurated for

their relief. The Consular and Diplomatic Appropriation bill was taken up, and after unimportant amendments the bill passed. The West Point Appropriation bill was also considered, amended and passed.
