

SUPREME COURT DECISION ON THE LEGAL TENDER ACT.

Something over a year ago the Supreme Court, consisting of eight members, there being, at the time, a vacancy on the bench, decided, by a major-ity of one, that the Legal Tender act was not. in its nature retrospective, construction of contracts entered into before its passage in 1862. That obcurrency legalized after such contracts and the decision was accepted as prop- I think just a little more rain would er and final. I don't think more than judgment under the decision for a difference between gold and paper money at the time of settlement. for debts contracted before the opinion of the Supreme Court was given. Everybody seemed to acquiesce in the decision, and business was conducted quietly with reference to it, and no one felt disposed to question its fairness or legality. But time affects changes that are somewhat remarkable, and otherwise unaccountable; and in regard to this question, which has been considered finally determined, the same Court, consisting at present of nine members instead of eight, two of whom are new to the bench, and for years able and successful advocates before the tribunal upon which they now sit, has just reversed its former decision, such reversal being announc-ed on last Monday. The division of the Bench is as follows: Chief Justice Chase and the three surviving associate Justices who formerly united with him, still declare that the act is not binding as to obligations contracted before its passage. The other three who were of the opinion that the law was retroactive, are of the same mind now, and with the concurrence of the two new Justices, (Strong, of Pensylvania, and Bradley, of New Jersey,) enforce as a law of the land that which five Judges, within a year, have declared to be illegal. There are some strange circumstances connected with this transaction, and the result will not increase the faith of the people in the highest tribunal in our land, whose judgments should be pronounced only after a full and mature deliberation, and when once given, should establish and settle the precedent to govern in subsequent cases. The effect of this decision can but favor the interest of powerful corporations wielding large political and moneyed influence, as against individual parties. Notwithstanding the disarrangement in business which will necessarily be created, the decision would be readily acquiesced in, if no doubts were entertained of its legality, or if it were in harmony with the views generally entertained on the subject. But the decision, however justified by legal technicalities, violates common sense. It will also be remembered that the first decision was reached only after long discussion and study, whereas at present the question was argued on Tuesday, and the decision arrived at on the following Monday. The Judges have resolved to not prepare their opinion until at leisure in December next. Would it not have been well to reserve the judgment also? It was known before hand that the Bench, as at present organized, would grant a re-argument of the question, and that the former judgment of the Court would be reversed, notwithstanding that public respect for the highest judicial tribunal in our land would be materially lessened by such reversal. Not only this fact will be mentioned in censuring the action of the Court in this instance, but further,


