A cheerful giver.

One of the most approved instances of systematic benevolence that has lately come to our knowledge, was related to the writer, for some evenings since, by a worthy clergyman. The incident is best narrated in his own words:

Night before last I was in my library, putting the finishing touches to my next Sunday morning's sermon, when the door-bell rung, and, shortly afterwards one of my parishioners entered. Apologizing for breaking in upon my meditations at so late an hour, he explained that he came to ask me to "put him to work."

"Gladly," said I, "but my dear sir, what would you like to do?" "To make a long story as short as possible, doctor," he rejoined, "first let me say at once that I have a hundred dollars in my pocket, which I would like to invest. I can't eat my Christmas dinner, knowing that there must be a good many poor families in this neighborhood without a bite to put in their mouths, or a fire to warm them. I have come to you to find these poor people out; and, what is more, I want to go and see them myself. I think it will do me good. It is a selfish feeling, may be, but I cannot help it. I am going to try if I cannot reduce my religion to practice, just for this once, and if you will help me, God bless you."

I confessed I contemplated my visitor with a feeling of some surprise. My acquaintance with him had been but slight. He was a poor-holder but not a communicant. In fact, there had been nothing in my limited knowledge of the man to lead me to anticipate that his feelings should take this turn; but after congratulating him upon his commendable determination, I at once set about gratifying his wish. Without traveling very far, we called on several poor families, whose hearts were made glad by his timely donations, and in cases where sickness as well as poverty had to be borne, his offerings were commensurately large. By midnight his one hundred dollars had all been disposed of. He had met the recipients face to face, and learned from their own lips something of their every-day privations. Sad narratives they were, for the most part, but I doubt not that he had the effect upon him that he desired; they "did him good," and an acceptable proof of the fact was afforded me next day, when the postman brought me a letter from him, enclosing another fifty-dollar bill, which he begged me to invest for him in the same way.—*Episcopate.*

Then shall we be permitted at the last to look back upon our lives with satisfaction, feeling that we have "done what we could," and that our Father regards us with smiles of approbation.

While there is so much sin and misery in the world, a man has no right to lull himself to sleep in a paradise of self-improvement and self-enjoyment; in which there is but one supreme Adam, one perfect specimen of humanity—namely himself. He ought to go out and work—fight, if it must be—whatever duty calls him. Nay, even a woman has hardly any right in these days, to sit still and dream. The life of action is nobler than a life of thought.

To everything beneath there comes a last, and of all futurity this is the only portion of the time that can in all cases be infallibly predicted. Let the sanguine then take warning, and the disheartened take courage; for to every joy and to every sorrow, to every hope and to every fear, there will come a last day, and the man ought so to live by foresight, that while he learns in every state to be content, he shall in each be prepared for another, whatever that other may be.

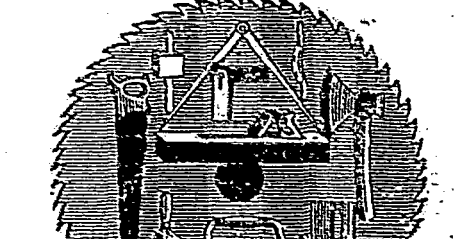
