

lesson does the history of South Bend. furnish? The manufacturing interests already located in the city, are such that it needs no prophetic vision to see the bright future of the place. They are such as make the growth and improvement of the city a necessity. The place will never again retrograde, while it is generally conceded that before many years, South Bend, as a manufacturing city, will be placed in the front rank of the cities of this western country. We would like to give a brief description of the leading manufactories of South Bend, but could not do the subject justice within the usual limits of a newspaper article. We

find here established the finishing shops of the well known Singer Sewing Machine-Co., who keep constantly in their employ_upwards of four hundred hands. Next of importance perhaps is the Studebaker's Wagon and Carriage Factory. This firm is now putting up a new building the size of which we learned, but have since forgotten. It is immensely large however, and will compare with any in the city when completed. The Birdsells' Clover Huller Factory is very large, and in its arrangement is said to be the model shop of the West. This company also have several hundred men in their employ. Their machines are of a world-wide reputation, being the most complete Clover Huller ever invented. The Furniture manufacturing Company of South Bend (of which Mr. John Knoblock is President) is doing a large and profitable business. There are also an extensive Chair Factory, three Flouring mills, two Paper mills, a large Iron Foundry and Plow factory, and many other factories of importance that we did not visit and do not mention. These factories give life and impetus to the place, and as a necessary result, have caused, within the last two years, to be built in the city over eight hundred dwellings, besides several new business blocks. It is estimated that at present there are no less than four hundred residence buildings under process of construction. There is a constantly growing demand for manufactories in this part of the country. As from year to year the great Western prairies become settled and brought under a state of cultivation, this section must give less attention to agricultural pursuits, and like the East. pay more attention to manufacturing interests. The places where manufacturing is first started and successfully conducted, must necessarily take the lead in the progress and development of the country. We mention this fact not only as congratulatory to South Bend, but also to encourage the awaking interests which is being taken in this direction in our own vil lage. 


