



Proposing to add to the Constitution the following new section, to stand as section three of article 19-A, "Of railroads :

The Législature shall provide by law for the payment by the counties, townships, and municipalities of this State, of all bonds or oth-er obligations heretofore issued and negotiated, and the purchase price thereof realized, pre-vious to the 27th day, of May, A. D. 1870, in pursuance of acts of the Legislature, by such counties, townships, and municipalities, sever-sally, for and in aid of any railroad company: *Provided* That such bonds on obligations shall sally, for and in aid of any railroad company: Provided That such bonds or obligations shall be paid by the county, township, or municipal-ity issuing or incurring the same, and in no event shall the State pay or become liable for any portion of such bonds or obligations. 


