The amount of National Bank circulation outstanding May 1, is \$318,364,667. Deducting from this amount the amount of legal-tender notes on deposit for the purpose of retiring National Bank circulation, we have \$802-929,249, which represents the amount of National Bank notes secured by bonds on deposit as above given. The net increase of National Bank circulation for the month of April was \$124,000. Amount of additional circulation issued, \$1,452,250.
