The Lansing *Republican* gives the following report of the business of the State Treasurer :

The balance of cash in the State Treasury August 4, was \$644,542.56; receipts during the week ending Aug. 11 were \$28,299.98; payments dur-ing same time were \$14,231.92; balin Treasury Aug. 11, 1877, \$659,-610.62; increase for the week \$15,-068.06.

The Inter-Ocean says that somebody has stated that the public lands available for cultivation are already disposed of. This is absurb. There are great fertile districts in the West that have not been surveyed or explored even. It is estimated that not more then one-fourth of the surveyed lands have been disposed of, and the unsurveyed public lands in the different States and Territories amount to 1,-132,665,244 acres.

At a late meeting of the Board of Health, the State Inspector of Illuminated Oils reported having inspected 59,380 barrels of oil during the year ending July 31st, 1877, 668 of which were rejected and shipped out of the State. He reports having frequently found low test oils branded, Michigan 150 test, when some of these would flash as low as 76. These low test oils are generally shipped to some out of the way place where the inspector will not be apt to find it, and sold. There have been but two accidents from explosion, one of which was caused by using low test oil, and the other by using naphtha, bought for mechanical purposes.

Reports of the famine in India represent a sickening sight of affairs in the Empire. It is stated that the striking area contains 18,000,000 sufferers dependent for food upon the activity and exertions of those who transport grain to the country ; that the Presidency is powerless to satisfy their wants, and that all aid that can be secured is necessary to the salvation of life. Over 500,000 people have perished, and more have been found dead on a single morning than died during the whole Bengal famine. Passenger trains have been partially discontinued on the roads to enable relief trains to get through, and a frantic appeal is sent to the principal cities of England, Scotland, Ireland and India for assistance in the hour
