Honey Sponge Cake-One large cup of honey, one cup of flour, five eggs. Beat yolks and honey together, beat the whites to a froth; mix all together, stirring as little as possible; flavor with lemon juice. or extract.

Railroad Honey Cake-One cup of honey, a heaping cup of flour, one tea-spoonful cream of tartar, one-half teaspoonful soda, three eggs and a little lemon juice; stir all together ten minutes. bake twenty minutes in a quick oven.

To Clean Black Lace-Squeeze softly and often in skimmed milk; when it seems clean, put it in clean skimmed milk, squeeze again, lay it on sheets of white paper, draw out scallops and edges with finger, cover with stiff paper and a heavy weight heavy weight.

All the starch in potatocs is found very hear the surface; the heart contains but little nutriment. Ignorance of this fact may form a plausible excuse for those who cut off thick parings, but none to those who know better. Circulate the injunction, "pare thin the potato skin."

Vegetable Stock-Olean and cut up some carrots, celery, turnips, onions, let-tuce, parsnips and herbs; put them in a stewpan, with butter and a little water, and stew until the water is evaporated and the butter begins to hiss; then fill up with fresh water; add nutmeg, pepper, salt and a few green peas, simmer for three hours; strain and use for maigre soups of any

Roast meat as more digestible than boiled, because the coating on the out-side, pr duced by sudden contact with great heat, retains the savory and soluble elements. Frying is most objectionable, and, unless handled with great skill, it not only renders the meat harder and more indigestible, but it imbues it with boiling fat and destroys the flavor. No meat diet is so economical as the prepa-ration of soups and stows, since even shin bones, broken up, have a nutritive value of one-third that of beef in carborn and one-sixth of nitrogen.

German method of Blacking Leather-Take two pounds of bark of elder, and the same quantity of filings of rust of iron; steep them in two gallons of river water, and put them in a cask or earthen vessel closely stopped. After it has then stood two months; put to the liquid, when well pressed out, one pound of powdered nutgalls, and a quarter of a pound of copperas; and then, after stirring it over a good fire, press out the liquid, with which the leather is to be three or four times brushed over, when it becomes of an ex-cellent and durable black.

Apple Fritters-One pint of sweet milk, six eggs, flour enough to form a stiff batter, a pinch of salt, half a teaspoonful of saleratus, a teaspoonful of cream of tartar; then slice some good sour apples rather thin and mix in the batter. Fry in hot lard, browning them nicely on both sides. Sauce, a little cream and sugar. They are nice made of raisins or currants instead of apples. Delicious if made of canned peaches, and the juice of the peaches well sweetened and poured over them and served, for sauce.

A Turkish Legend.

Mchar-Schedig was stung. Her servants, remembering the gipsy's prophecy, uttered loud cries of distress, and, throwing open the doors of the tower, rushed out frantically, exclaiming that all was lost. Then Prince of Persia rushed in, seized Metast-Schegid in his arms, and sucked the wound in her shoulder until he had extracted from it all the venom left there by the asp. The Sultan, when h heard of the young man's noble and devoted conduct, declared that he should be his son-in-law, and the Prince of Persia made Mehar-Schegid his wife. and lived with her very happily.



The Norwegian is the smallest of all European nations, but its commercial fleet is the third largest in the world. The Norwegian flag is, of all foreign flags, that which is most frequently seen in the harbor of New York, and through the Sound which connects the Baltic with the North Sea, and forms the highway from London to St. Petersburg, often from three to four hundred Norwegian crafts of evcry description pass during one single day. In Norway, although not every man is a sailor, every person is nevertheless more or less connected with the shipping interests. To build ships or to sail them, to own ships or to have a part in them, is a point in everybody's life, all along those housand fjords which fringe the coasts of Norway, and to the inland farmer the most common manner of placing his sayings is to go to the sea and buy a part in a ship. Many a Norwegian vessel, carry-ing timber to England and coal back to Denmark, or dried fish to Naples and oranges back to St. Petersburg, represents the whole fortune of a village of parish, in which even the servant girl may have a share, and to many a well-to-do Norwegian farmer the only source from which he draws and can draw ready money is from the ship part.

A new kind of electric light, lately experimented upon at Berlin, on the roof of the Siemens-Halske works in that city, proved so successful that ordinary writing could be read at a distance of a mile. When the light was thrown toward the clouds, by means of a mirror, there ap-peared a luminous train thereon, which much resembled a tail of a comet, and drew together great crowds of spectators in the streets. Signals made by the instrument were also repeated upon the clouds, becoming thus visible at a very great distance. The experiments were made in the presence of a large number of artillery and other branches of the government service, and were continued for nearly two hours. The instrument, which is provided with a locomotive engine, is to be set up in the Tegel artillery polygon for further experiment, the German War Department intending to purchase sever-



And many were the discussions that occurred before Air. O'Shaughnessy's awful misdeed and skillful gluing were discovered. Then there was a very mad collection of scientists, and the young man would have been dismissed had not Bulwer used his influence. Warned by his blunder, Mr. O'Shaughnessy under-took the study of natural history, and there is now no one in the Museum better skilled in that department.

## VillageOrdinanceEstablishing By-Law.

The Common Council of the village of Buchanan ordains, on this 15th day of March, A. D. 1879, the following By-Law :

TO PROVIDE FOR THE LICENSING OF SALOON KEEPERS.

imself or his servants, directly or indirectly sell or offer for sale any spirituous, intox-icating or malt liquors, shall be deemed to be a saloon keeper within the meaning of this By-Law, and shall pay annually a license fee of one hundred dollars for such saloon kept by him; and on failure to pay the same and obtain such license as is herein-after provided, he shall be punished by fine not less than filty dollars and not exceeding one hundred dollars, and by imprisonment in the village prison not less than ten days and not exceeding thirty days, or in the county jail not less than thirty and not exceeding ninety days: Provided, however, that this By-Law shall not apply to sellers of drugs and medicines, who shall have given bonds and mentiones, and shart in by the laws of this State, and shall have complied with the conditions thereof.

SEC. 2. Every saloon keeper, within the meaning of the above section, shall annually, on the first Mondav in May, pay to the Treas-urer of said Village said license fee of one hundred dollars, and the said Treasurer shall undred dointrs, and the said Treasurer shall give to the person so paying a receipt for the same specifying for what it is given and the date thereof, and upon the presentation of said receipt to the Recorder of said Vil-lage he shall give a Certificate of License, signed by him as Recorder of the Viller of signed by him as Recorder of the Village of

A True Wild Flower.
