#### **Republican State Convention.**

A Republican State Convention to nominate State officers and for the transaction of other busin ness, will be held at the opera house, in the village of Kalamazoo, on Wednesday, August 80, 1882, at 11 o'clock A. M.

11 o clock A. M. In accordance with a resolution adopted at Grand Rapids, May 10, 1876, every county will be entitled to one delegate for each 500 of the total vote cast

to one delegate for each 500 of the total vote cast for Governor at the last State election (in ISS0) and one sdditional delegate for every fraction of 300 votes, but each organized county will be entitled to at least one delegate. Under a resolution of ISS8 no delegate will be entitled to a seat in the Convention who does not reside in the County he proposes to represent. In accordance with a resolution adopted at De-troit, June 23, ISS0, the Secretary of each County Convention is requested to forward to the Secretary of the State Central Committee, by the earliest mail after the delegates to the State Convention are chosen, a certified list of such delegates as are entitled to seats in the State Convention from their respective counties. 




rapidly in public estimation during the past four years. His election by a handsome majority is sure to follow the nomination which he will soon receive. -Post and Tribune.

The growth of some of our great Western cities within the last decade is something anomalous. They have grown out of all proportion with the surround ing communities. Where were found, a few years ago, nothing but swamp and "primeval groves," are found now paved streets and magnificent buildings. So rapid has been the concentration of wealth and population in certain centers that people, at a loss to comprehend the forces which are drawing them together, are wondering why so many are leaving the comforts of the country to live in the alleys and slums of crowded cities. The tendency of modern civilization is to mass population and wealth, so the urban population all over the Union is growing very much faster than the rural; and the urban population of the West is increasing more rapidly than that of the East or South. The growth of the urban population of the ten Western States, Ohio, Iudiana, Illinois, Iowa, Wisconsin, Minnesota, Missouri, Kansas and Nebraska has been 61.6 per cent. from 1870 to 1880. The population of cities of 10,000 and upward is about one-fourth of the entire nation, while a few years ago it was not more than one-sixteenth. The population of great cities is almost one seventh of our entire population, and thirty years ago it was about one-fortieth. This shows the rapid growth of great cities. At the taking of the last census there were in the nation 243 cities whose population was 10,000 and upward, and of these twenty had a population of 100,000 and
