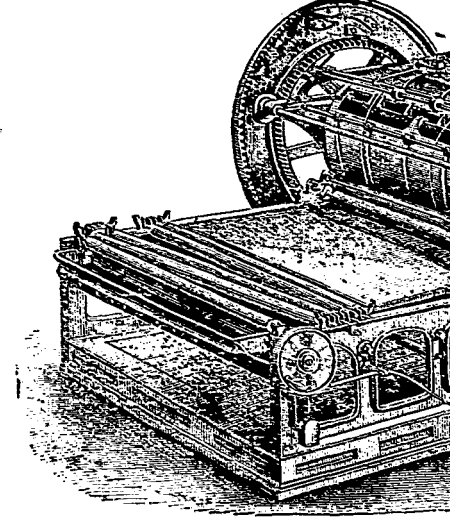

The bridegroom could see her from the outside, saw a woman pushing a barrow with nothing on but a white cloth, and she was right up to the bride's train. The ceremony we fled back again. A farmer told me in his flock of sheep, which he had bought from a wealthy man, he gave it to his son, a boy fifteen years of age, who saved it and raised it. The father called it his sunnower, and the son called it his sun. The father said to the son, "I wish my mother sold the other lamb, and I will take this one gone with them, and the pay for it, he tucked it into his wallet and carried it off to pay tithes." Now this farmer did not intend anything wrong. Least of all did he intend to wrong his boy.
