A Greenback Congressional Covention was held at Kalamazoo, Monday, and nominated Geo. L. Yaple, of Mendon, for Congressman. It is now left for the Democrats to fuse, as Hon. Chas. S. May, who was the most promnent man mentioned in connection with the Democratic nomination has refused to be a candidate.

Three of the Michigan Republican members of Congress, Hons. J. C. Burrows, R. G. Horr, and E. S. THE STATE CONVENTION. The Republican State Convention convened in the new Academy of Music, at Kalamazoo, yesterday, and was called to order by Wm. Livingstone, Jr., of Detroit. The Convention opened by the following brief prayer, by Rev. O. C. Brown, of Kalamazoo:

"Almighty God, we pray Thee for Thy blessing upon this assembly of representative men gathered from all parts of this State to exercise its important privilege of freemen. Give them that breadth of wisdom to decide rightly upon all questions of principle or policy that shall come before them, and select the very best men to present to the people, and when they have been so nominated, we beseech Thee that they may be elected, and that when they be elected there may be given un-to them wisdom for the right discharge of their duties, so that they may meet Thine approval and the approval of all the people for Thy name's sake, Amen." [Cheers.]

Temporary organization was effected by the appointment of Hon. J. W. French, of Three Rivers, temporary chairman, and James H. Stone, of Detroit, temporary secretary. 9. It is a fundamental right of the people to alter, from time to time, the organic law of the State, as new circumstances or growing evils may re-quire, "laying its foundations on such principles, and organizing its powers in such form as to them shall seem

most likely to effect their safety and happiness." The evils of intemperance have become so great that in the name of patriotism the most efficient meas-

evils to the minimum, And as the members of no political party are wholly agreed as to whether this can be best done through the prohibition or the regulation of the traffic in intoxicating liquors, and as the people are and ought to be the final arbiters of this question,

and as more than a hundred thousand among the moral and intelligent people of the State have asked by petition that the question be put to the people, by the submission to them of a prohib-itory constitutional amendment, we declare that we believe it would be wise and patriotic for the next legislature to submit such an amendment to a direct vote of the people, and we demand that it be so submitted. 10. The Republicans of Michigan demand a full legislative investigation of

the transportation question, with a view to securing such legislative enactments as will prevent unjust discriminations in rates by the railroad lines operating in the State.

11. During the twenty-eight years in which the affairs of the State have been administered by the Republican party, they have been conducted in a manner to challenge the approval of all citizens. Efficiency, integrity and economy have been the standards of service. The prosperity of the State has been constant and increasing. The population has augmented from 500,000 to 1,700,-

000. Wealth and production have increased in greater ratio. The unfortu-nates have been cared for, education fostered. The public debt has been substantially canceled, the credit of the State cleansed from the stain of Democratic repudiation, and raised to the highest point, while in the great struggle for liberty and Union Michigan has been second to none of her sis-

ter States. 12. The administration of Governor David H. Jerome has been characterized by the Republican standard of excellence, and has fitly continued the long roll of Republican administrations which have reflected honor upon the State of Michigan.

13. We arraign the Democratic party as the same incapable Bourbon par-ty that it has ever been. Passing over its shameful record before, during and directly after the civil war, its recent history proves that it has neither repented nor reformed. During six years of supremacy in congress it showed it self incapable of a single great measure of legislative or administrative reform. Neither the tariff, the currency, the revenue, the civil service, the army, the Indian policy, or any other great interest received improvement at its hands. They confined their efforts at reform to turning out Union soldiers to make room for rebels, to usurping executive prerogatives, refusing ecessary appropriations, and obstructing the administration of the laws. At the last congressional election they stole numerous seats in the House of Representatives by fraud of tissue ballots and false counting, and as a party, endorsed the fraud by keeping the sto-
