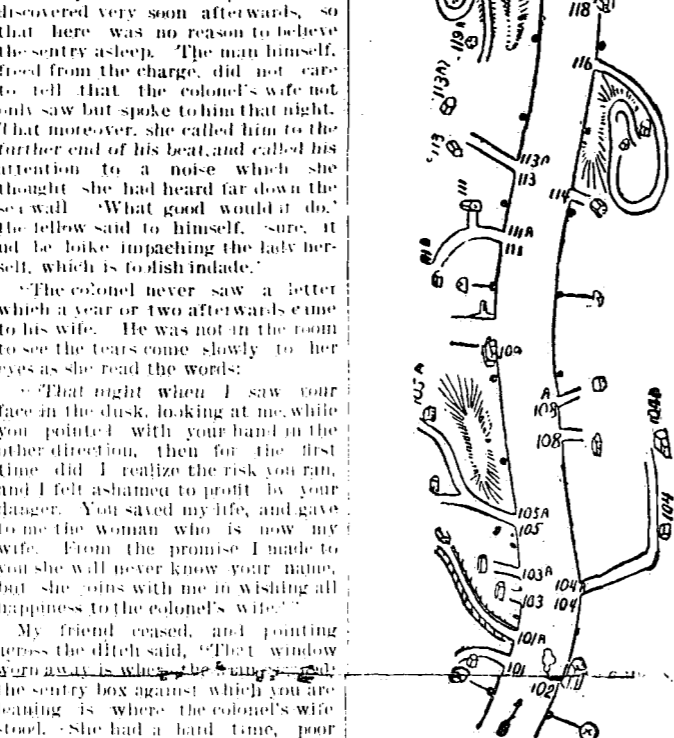

The Independent's Platform.

- 1. Equality before the law for all the citizen, regardless of circumstances.
2. The total prohibition of the liquor traffic.
3. A full legal tender government currency, and no currency issues from any other source.
4. Equal taxation, and to that end a graduated income tax.

The Republican Committee are furnishing papers of that party a supplement containing a serial story in which the Republican idea is dihed up in fiction. Some think it a strange means to use in supporting a party, but as the greater portion of the arguments of their orators and writers, for ten years past have been purely fiction it is but little out of their usual course.

The Prohibition Senatorial convention for the Seventh senatorial district was held in Dowagiac on Friday, last, Sept. 9. C. C. Sherrill of Cassopolis was elected chairman and J. R. Hill, of Buchanan secretary and the convention proceeded to elect a candidate for senator. Willis M. Farr presented the name of Burton T. Morley, of Buchanan and on motion he was nominated by acclamation. A motion that the convention elect a Senatorial Committee of four, two from each county, was carried and the following elected: C. C. Sherrill, Cassopolis; J. R. Hill, Buchanan; W. M. Farr, Dowagiac; George Fryman, Berrien Springs. The convention then adjourned.

As Mr. Blaine said in his recent public letter that the people have gained millions by reciprocity and that they had lost many millions by its not being enacted sooner, and as reciprocity is only limited free trade, the Independent would like to know how many millions we are now losing by not giving free trade broader limits?

Mr. Blaine certainly justifies that plank in the Prohibition platform which says: "Tariff should be levied only as a defense against foreign countries which levy tariff upon our bar or our products from their markets, revenue being incidental."

Either reciprocity is a humbug or the Prohibitors have struck the key note on the tariff question. We are prepared to maintain the latter.

And now the Democrats are in a Peck of trouble about a labor commissioner in New York who reports that business has been more prosperous and labor better paid since the McKinley bill went into effect than before. As the Republicans claim this a testimony to the benefit of a high protective tariff, the Democracy never dispute it, but spend their time cursing their own official long enough to think they might discover that this report cut both ways and was really against the Republican idea.

The McKinley bill cut the previous tariff down nearly 10 per cent, besides arranging for reciprocity or free trade with several countries. Now if this diminution of the tariff has proved so great a blessing is it not proof positive that the whole protective system is a curse? Stop swearing and look into the matter.

Upwards of 5,000 saloons in New York city are either owned outright by a score of brewers and distillers or mortgaged to them for the full amount that they contain would sell at. These saloons control fully 50,000 votes and to some degree influence many others. Here are twenty men then whose combined influence throw 50,000 votes into the balance for the party that is most liberal toward their business. No wonder then that a leading brewer was put on the most influential committee of a Na-

tional Republican convention or that the thoroughness leading to both Democratic and Republican conventions were literally strewn with emptied bottles.

One third of the saloons of Chicago are under mortgage to eight brewers and distillers, and their political influence directs the brewer's and liquor dealer's associations and yet we have those who whimper about bringing the saloon into politics. Why bless your simple heart it is already there and has for twenty years been a controlling influence. To get it out of politics is the aim of the Prohibition party.

To call a national political convention a gathering of could be open actors would be severe language, but to say that they are really leeches would express the exact truth. The common method of platform making is to declare a thousand and one detriments to a thousand and one subject, and then to forget what is convenient and expedient, and to emphasize the strong planks as the revelation of popular sentiment may show where the popular strength may lie. Look at the present situation. Not one of the great "national" parties in the present campaign is the conveyor of its own convictions as expressed in its platforms. Look at them:

Platforms are not made as honest declaration of opinions, but only as expedients to give the politicians a great deal of room for maneuvering. The platform is a mere device to get very disreputable business. Platforms do not define policies, but simply declare a strategic ground.—Detroit Sun-News.

True, but the politicians are not so much to blame for this disgraceful duplicity as are the voters who in their unrighteous worship of a party name will suffer every injustice from the hands of its leaders ere they will sever their connection with it. It is not long since an Indiana delegate plead with the platform committee of his party state convention for just sufficient show of temperance legislation to give him and others of like conviction an excuse for remaining in it; he knowing that such a plank would remain a dead letter. One of the committee remarked after he was gone: "You couldn't drive that fellow out of the party with a club."

Just so long as voters will tie to the dead body of a party name after all the principles that brought it into being have been cast aside, just so long will they be the playing and slaves of corrupt politicians.

No party can solve the labor question that does not solve the liquor question. These two questions are eternally bound together. (One of these evils cannot fall without the other. The party which proposes to do down one and leave the other is simply attempting the impossible.—Beacon.

To Study the Bible.
Mr. Moody's Bible Institute in Chicago is making great preparations for the coming winter and next year, with special reference to the need there is for aggressive Christian work among the vast crowds who will visit the Fair. Two new stories upon the main building are about completed. These will afford accommodations for one hundred additional men. Mr. Moody, himself, expects to spend a large proportion of the year 1893 in Chicago, and is trying to secure leading men from the old country and America to preach the Gospel in English and other languages, and also to give instructions in the Institute, in addition to the regular corps of teachers.

Those who enter the school in October, or as soon after that as possible will have the best opportunities in the work. In accepting applicants, preference will, of course be given to those expecting to stay throughout the year. None are admitted but such as are preparing for some form of Christian work.

It seems likely that more room will have to be provided for the Women's Department in order to accept all the promising applicants. Special attention will be paid to the work of the Musical Department of the Institute. It is proposed to gather and train a large male choir, to sing at the services to be held during the World's Fair, and extra privileges will be granted to pupils having exceptionally good voices, who will remain during that period. The musical term begins the first Tuesdays of October, January, April and July.
