Negotiations have been progressing for some time looking toward the acquisition of considerable more working capital for the Buchanan Power & Electric Company, and it is stated that parties with abundant means have signified a willingness to invest capital in the concern, but before doing so in-stated that the affairs of the company be settled in order to find out just how the company stood. In order to do this in a legal manner and avoid any possibility of future litigation, the Power & Electric Company, on Saturday afternoon, made an assignment of all their interests to Mr. Joseph L. Richards of the Zinc Collar Pad Company. As soon as the claims are all filed and matters are satisfactorily fixed up, the parties referred to, it is expected, will advance sufficient funds to clear up all indebtedness, taking in exchange a one-half interest in the concern, Messrs. Holmes & English retaining the other one-half interest.

**The Hatch Cutlery Company**  
In a Receiver's Hands.  
Last September the Hatch Cutlery Company gave the Michigan Trust Co., of Grand Rapids, a trust mortgage to secure payment of 150 bonds of \$500 each, at seven per cent interest payable semi-annually. The first installment of interest became due March 10th, 1895, but for some reason the Cutlery Company failed to make provision for its payment. On Friday last the Michigan Trust Company commenced foreclosure proceedings and petition was made for the appointment of a receiver. Mr. Lewis H. Withey, president of the Trust Company, was made receiver, and came down and took possession of the plant on Saturday afternoon.

The factory was shut down Monday and Tuesday for the purpose of taking an inventory, but commenced running again Wednesday morning. Mr. F. J. Millar, Secretary of the Cutlery Company has been placed in charge by Mr. Withey and states that the company expects to continue and that all claims will be paid in full. We trust for the sake of our merchants that such will be the outcome.

Mr. Millar stated this morning that the payroll was being made up and preparations made for paying the help in full up to the time of the receivership. Inquiry has developed the facts that the appointment of a receiver was necessitated by the inability of the various interests in the company, to arrange and agree on a reorganization plan, which contemplated making some sweeping reductions in the expense of operating the plant, and looking toward placing the concern on a solid financial basis. At any event there is no doubt but that the Cutlery factory will be operated either by a reorganized Hatch Cutlery Company or by the Michigan Trust Company in the interest of the holders of the bonds.



SETTING ONION PLANTS.

Now that the "new onion culture" is so generally employed the planting of onion seedlings is an important subject for consideration.



Job, and you should make it as easy as possible by preparing the soil in such a way as to enable the operator to plant without tilling.

The index finger answers every purpose when the land is fresh and "melting" as an ash heap. Sometimes a rain comes and the soil after it was already marked out and in best shape for planting.

During the season of plant setting a light harrow is a convenient help in cutting the plants from the greenhouse or frames to the garden or field.

There is now in the market a two horsepower planting machine, which automatically and successfully sets all kinds of vegetable or small fruit plants thoroughly firm, and at the same time waters them.

Regarding what mixture of grasses ought to be sown on land designed for pasture for three or four years, Prairie Farmer says that very much will depend upon the character of the land, as light or heavy, high or low, dry or moist.

Light lands should not be sown to pasture for a length of time, as they need not be plowed so deeply, for the seed will rot in the soil.

Early Laying and Brown Eggs. The editor of Farm Journal says: Our experience with the Wyandotte can be got to early laying before the Plymouth Rock. The Plymouth Rocks generally give the larger and browner eggs, although both these qualities can be strongly planted in Wyandottes.

CORN EXPERIMENTS. As conducted at the Illinois Experiment Station—Summary of Results. The following varieties showed the important difference in the varieties of corn and illustrated the need of careful selection.

give a chance for best cultivation. Shallow cultivation has given better results than deep, the average yield for five years being 5.9 bushels greater for the shallow cultivation than for the deep.

Crossing varieties has usually increased the yield. Removing tassels in 1904 increased the yield 13 per cent, while in two former years there was no advantage found in detasseling.

Peppermint Growing. In Michigan the commercial average yield will be much as that of a year ago, although damage to the roots is feared, owing to ravages of the cutworms.
