Five Leaders of the Reform Committee at Johannesburg.

LONDON, April 23.—The secretary of state for the colonies, Mr. Joseph Chamberlain, announced in the house of commons today that the five leaders of the reform committee of Johannesburg (George F. Hammond, Francis Rhodes, George Far-

rell, Philip Phillips and Charles Leonard) had been condemned to death. Mr. Chamberlain added that upon hearing the news he cabled to the Governor of Cape Colony, Sir Hercules Robinson, to communicate the following to President Kruger: "The government has determined that the sentence of death has been passed upon the five leaders of the reform committee. They can feel no doubt that your own will command the sentence and have assured parliament of their conviction that this is your honor's intention."

Mr. W. J. Galloway, Conservative member for South-West Lancashire, asked whether the law under which the leaders of the Johannesburg reform committee were tried, does not provide for the commutation of their sentence in the event of their death. Mr. Chamberlain said he was unable to answer the question.

TRANSPLANTING TOOLS.
Trowel and Roller which Save Time in Handling Small Plants.

Considerable hand labor can be avoided by planting in the ditch. The loose soil can be turned in by a roller, making it possible to ditch when the ground is frozen hard elsewhere.
