TURTLES MADE TO CUT WEEDS. With Queer Harness, Tortoises are Made to Operate a Kind of Shears

Goshen, Ind., Aug. 28.—Owners of the big onion fields south of here are putting mud turtles to a peculiar use and their experience with them and the successful operation has caused the method to be taken up generally by onion growers all over the northern part of the state.

The turtles are literally harnessed and made to operate on board tracks along the onion rows. Thin steel knives are fastened to them in such a way that when in action they cut down the weeds as clean as though a lawn mower had been run through the place.

First the shell is smoothed with a file and sandpaper so the onion tops cannot be cut. Then four crew eyes are placed in the shell, to which is connected a copper wire fastened to a trolley. The trolley runs the whole length of the onion field.

The postmastership at Cassopolis, which is to be settled next month, is commanding the attention of Congressman Hamilton and the citizens and politicians of the Cass county seat town. A. N. Osborn, a traveling salesman, whose home is at Cassopolis, was brought forward and a petition was quite largely signed.

Delegations for one candidate or the other are to go to Niles and travel up the stairway to Congressman Hamilton's office to press the claims of their favorite. The two sides keep a watchful eye on every move of the other and just at present it is the living issue in Cassopolis.—Dowagiac News.

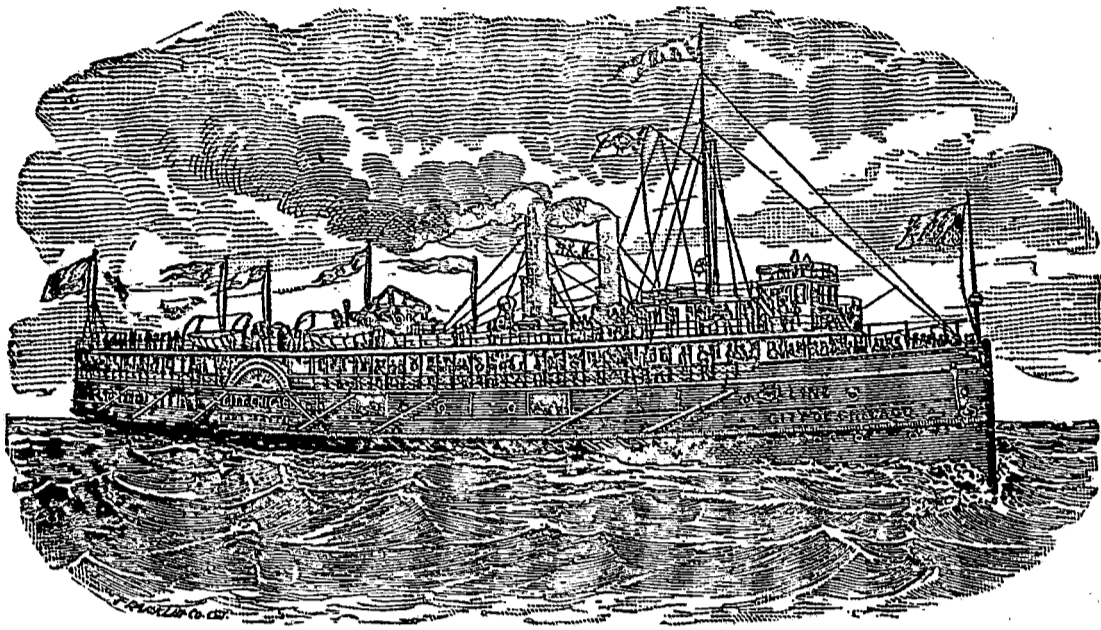
