When the proposal was made at the first Hague conference that the United States would give up the privilege of privateering provided the conference would abolish the right of seizing private property, the delegates, except those of Great Britain and France, expressed the hope that a second conference would consider the question. CASTRO PRAISES MR. RUSSELL.

Venezuelan President Pays a Tribute to the American Minister.

Caracas, Venezuela, June 1 (via Curacoa, June 7) .- President Castro, whose strength is returning gradually, attended congress Saturday and read his message to that body. Referring to the foreign relations of the republic of Venezuela, the president said: "I am pleased to inform you that our political relations with friendly countries are increasingly cordial. Within a short period the claims of Great Britain, Germany and Italy, which were given preference at The Hague, will be fully paid. As soon as these are settled the appropriation to meet them will be employed to pay the remainder of the claims against Venezuela.

"Our intercourse with the United States is entirely cordial, since we had the pleasure of receiving in this capitol W. W. Russell, the American envoy extraordinary and minister plenipotentiary. This distinguished diplomat has conducted the affairs of his government with us in an affable and conciliatory manner, thus contributing to remove the unpleasantness with that government occasioned by the discussion of certain matters with American citizens."

Mr. Floyd has contracted for almost every form of entertainment known to the amusement world, and also for several special features that have never been seen outside of New York and Chicago. His program as arranged includes: High diving, deep sea diving, gymnastic work on aparatus, tumbling, tight rope walking, trained animals, exciting cowboy races, and wild west scenes. He is at present endeavoring to arrange for a genuine western village to be shown on the grounds. 
