**"Undesirable" Umpire Remov-
ed From the Game**

After rendering several VERY UN-
FAIR decisions at the ball game,
Friday, the umpire was CALLED
OUT.

Having a woeful limited knowledge
of the rules that govern baseball and
possessing a cloudy vision not cap-
able of penetrating the horizon for at
least a distance of ten feet it is a pre-
requisite of the undesirable "ump" to
refrain from betting on the game, or
to render a decision favorable to an
"investing friend" or "himself" re-
gardless of the plain and fair merits,
or to go to radical extremes in lioniz-
ing and monopolizing a player whom
the entire patronage likes and ap-
proves of. It is considered a great
difficulty for a man acting as referee in
the best sport of our country to resist
the alluring temptation to "sell out"
or render unfair and unhealy rulings
for a paltry consideration.

When in commercial life the body
and very soul can be purchased for a
mere handful of money to the unfair,
foul or malicious degradation of oth-
ers it is not surprising that the same
conditions exist in sporting circles.

However, a step has been taken in
the right direction. Let the good
work go on for honor and integrity
will triumph, and let none of us fol-
low the footsteps of Judas of the an-
cient Biblical days.

polies), by income or inheritance tax,
must be made to pay its share of the


