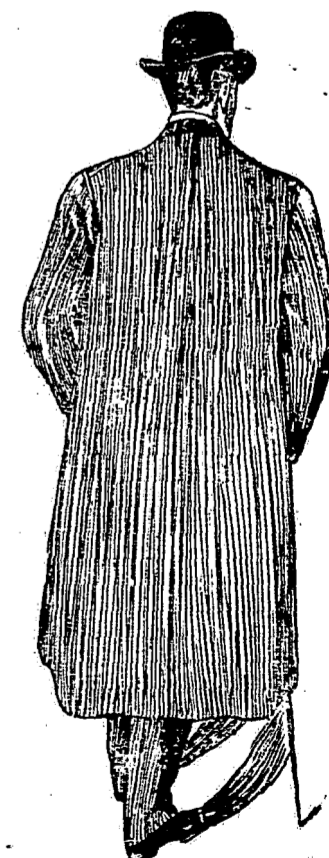
St. Joseph Saloons Apply their Own Lid

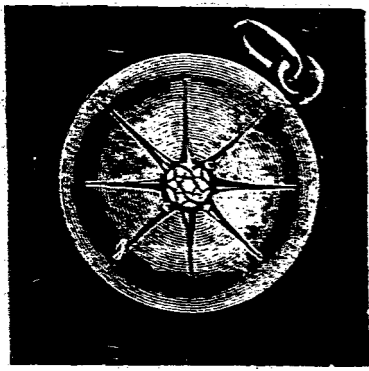

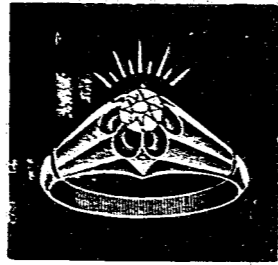

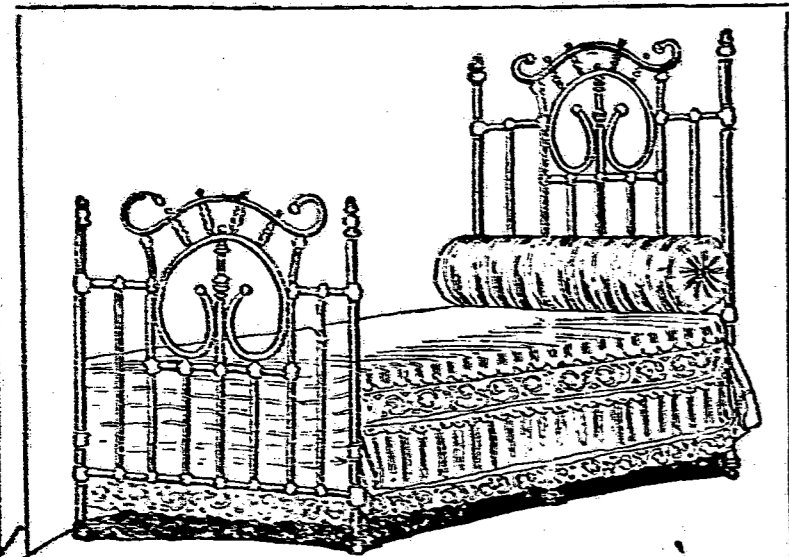
