

SLEEPER ANNOUNCES APPEAL TOWNS

GRAND RAPIDS AND KALAMAZOO
NAMED FOR WESTERN MICHIGAN BOARD MEETINGS; ALL APPOINTEES ACCEPT.

Lansing—While Gov. Sleeper will not announce the personnel of the district appeal boards until the list he has forwarded to Washington has been confirmed by President Wilson, he has outlined the districts in which the boards would hold hearings to revise the work of the county and district boards.

There will be four boards in the eastern district and three boards in the western district. The whole of the upper peninsula is included in the third division of the western district.

The first board of the western district will cover Allegan, Barry, Eaton, Van Buren, Kalamazoo, Berrien, Cass, St. Joseph. The second board of the western district will cover Emmet, Charlevoix, Antrim, Leelanau, Benzie, Grand Traverse, Kalamazoo, Manistee, Wexford, Missaukee, Mason, Lake, Oshtemo, Oceana, Newaygo, Mecosta, Muskegon, Montcalm, Ottawa, Kent, Ionia.

In the western district the sessions of the first board will be held at Kalamazoo, the second at Grand Rapids and the third at Marquette. Should it be deemed advisable when the hearings begin to enlarge the membership of each board of five men, five more may be added to each board. On each appeal board there must be a lawyer, a doctor, a representative of the industrial interests, a representative of the agricultural interests and a representative of labor. Practically every man who has been asked by Gov. Sleeper to serve on the board has consented to accept the responsibility.

Ionia—A telephone message at the jail announced that a man on South Dexter street had shot himself and Under Sheriff Hoppough immediately rounded up Corner Boynton and Marshal Alexander and they went in the sheriff's car and found the man. Upon being prodded he responded sleepily. He was uninjured, but was lying on the ground precisely as he might lie after killing himself with the gun which was beside him. It was a shotgun and upon being awakened he said that he was going a hunting. He didn't seem to be in just the condition to be trusted with firearms so he was taken to the jail. He gave his name as Mike Bucher.

MICHIGAN AVIATION FIELD OPENS AT MOUNT CLEMENS

Mount Clemens—Selfridge aviation field was formally opened here. Aspiring young Michiganders from every corner of the state were on hand to receive instruction on how to be a birdman. Many of them professed to be high school students anxious to fly for the allied armies.

The field was established by the government and is a replica of many others throughout the country. It creates a town, as it were, of 900 inhabitants six miles from Mount Clemens and incidentally comprises one of the largest aviation fields in the country.

Where the camp opened there formerly was 160 acres of timberland. This was cleared away to give a clean field of 600 acres.

DETROIT HOSPITAL UNIT DEPARTS FOR FRANCE

Detroit—Harper base hospital unit, No. 17, left for an eastern point Tuesday for preliminary training prior to departing for France. Approximately 1,000 fathers, mothers and other relatives of the members of the unit were at the depot to bid the boys farewell.

STATE TO SELL FISH DIRECT TO CONSUMER

NEW GAME WARDEN WILL TRY
OUT ECONOMY PLAN THIS
WINTER; FURNISH FISH
AT COST.

Lansing—The tip from the nation's food controller to eat fish was received with enthusiasm by State Game Warden John Baird who proposes to furnish the people of the state with a supply of fresh fish next winter will be able to make a big reduction in their household expenses if they are willing to co-operate.

Game Warden Baird says there are several inland lakes in the northern part of the state that have been regularly stocked with whitefish for the last thirty years. The whitefish is in no sense a game fish as it will not take any kind of a bait. The state fish law makes it illegal to take whitefish from the inland waters with either spear or net. Consequently they have multiplied during recent years to such an extent that there are tons and tons of them in some of the northern lakes.

Baird says that these lakes are not frozen over until the latter part of January and he proposes to take the whitefish from the lakes with nets. All game fish will be returned to the water. He will have the whitefish shipped to the principal cities and villages of the state and sold under the supervision of deputy game wardens. For instance, if it should cost ten cents per pound to place the fish on sale at Grand Rapids, Lansing, Flint or Detroit or wherever they may be shipped the purchaser will be charged that amount and no more.

MICHIGAN MAKING STRIDES FORWARD CHECK- ING TUBERCULOSIS

A life insurance company doing an extensive business in Michigan has just published a list of the causes of death in the case of 214 of its policy holders who died in this state during 1916. Tuberculosis comes eighth in the list, only 12 of the 214 deaths became in fighting the dread disease.

"There was a time when tuberculosis was much further toward the top in Michigan," said an official of the company. But Michigan has been taking rapid strides in the past decade in fighting this dread disease. And the work there has been done by the state anti-tuberculosis association, by the local societies and by all the organizations that are fighting tuberculosis is beginning to count.

"Life insurance statistics are a pretty reliable indication of real conditions. It is sometimes hard for the people of a state or any community to see the results of movements such as are being conducted against tuberculosis, but such things as insurance statistics show that work of this kind counts. But it usually takes a few years before the real results are made apparent."

AUTO TAGS BRING STATE \$2,225,401.02

Automobile licenses during the past six months brought the state \$2,225,401.02, according to Secretary of State Vaughan, who is making the quarterly apportionment of money among the various counties of the state.

During the last three months the automobile fees amounted to \$847,834.18, half of which goes to the state highway department for the construction and maintenance of state roads. The remaining 50 per cent is apportioned among the various counties according to the number of machines owned in each county. The county money can be used only for highway construction.

Berrien county's apportionment of this amount is \$6,838.23.

TELEPHONE POLE SAVES LIVES OF FIVE MOTORISTS

St. Joseph—A telephone pole is responsible for saving the lives of five persons who were autoing from Kalamazoo. C. C. Hall, R. D. Hall, a brother, Miss Esther Tunk and Mr. and Mrs. J. C. Dreher, all of Kalamazoo, were in the car which made a headlong dive down a thirty-five foot embankment south of this city. The telephone pole caught the car, allowing the occupants time to jump, and then crashed to the bottom, completely wrecking the car. The only injured person was the driver, C. C. Hall.

UPPER PENINSULA TO SUPPLY LUMBER

Cadillac—It is likely that the upper peninsula will supply most of the lumber for the army cantonment at Battle Creek, according to J. C. Knox, secretary of the Michigan Hardwood Dealers' association, and who will let contracts for the government.

Nearly 20,000,000 feet of lumber will be used at Battle Creek. Although contracts will be let to dealers in all parts of the state, it is believed most of it will come from the upper peninsula as lumber of that sort needed is scarce in this vicinity.

WORK STARTED ON NEW \$20,000 GRANT SCHOOL

Grant—Ground was broken Friday for the new \$20,000 schoolhouse at this place. Contractor Martin DeGraff of Grand Rapids is on the job, which will not be finished until November. The Baptist and Advent churches will be used till then.

STATE BREVITIES. RUBBER BOOTS SAVE MAN FROM LIGHTNING BOLT

Charlotte—The large, new barn nearly completed by Grand Kiplinger was struck by lightning and the sidings torn off from the top to bottom on both gables. The barn is about fifty feet in height. Mr. Kiplinger was standing in the barn at the time and the stable doors within two feet of him were shattered and he was stunned but not hurt by the shock. The fact that he was wearing rubber boots probably saved him from death. The barn did not catch fire.

Allegan—The Allegan County Fair association has set Sept. 25, 26, 27 and 28 as the days for the annual fair.

Fenton—George McNeal, attorney, thirty-two, lost his lower jaw by the explosion of a cannon he fired. His condition is critical.

Manistee—The Goshen Shirt company has taken a contract for 200,000 army shirts to be delivered at the rate of 50,000 a month.

Hastings—Charles Mason and T. B. Wilkinson, Maple Grove farmers who had a gill net in their possession contrary to law, were heavily fined.

Holland—Because he mixed liquor with gasoline James Davis of Saugatuck was assessed \$53.75 in fine and costs in Justice Van Schelven's court.

Traverse City—Northern Michigan's biggest crop, the cherry, will be ready for picking in a few days. A hurry up call has been spread for cherry pickers.

Owosso—Prizes amounting to \$150 are to be awarded the three farmers in the county whose farms are best tilled. Owosso business men donated the money and M. A. C. experts will be the judges.

Traverse City—Last winter Traverse City nearly froze to death. Traverse City is not taking these chances this year. One concern alone has already put in more than 5,000 tons of coal for the year's supply.

Grand Haven—When arraigned before Judge Cross, Fred Clark pleaded guilty to highway robbery. Clark and a companion recently held up John Aldring in the streets of Holland with the intent to rob him.

Battle Creek—Plans and specifications for seven Y. M. C. A. buildings to be operated in connection with the Michigan-Wisconsin army cantonment here have been placed in the hands of the construction engineers.

Reed City—The Reed City bonding proposition carried almost unanimously and a road will be built through the town, making the last connecting link of the Mackinac Trail through Oshtemo county. The mile will cost \$8,000.

Flint—Genevieve Gerlish of Bay City, aged eight months, was crushed to death and her mother, Mrs. John Gerlish, and three others were severely injured when an automobile in which they were riding overturned near Montrose.

Jackson—The prison board of control has secured, by purchase, the Root farm of 800 acres in Henrietta and Leoni townships. The purchase of this farm gives the prison a total of 2,250 acres of land under cultivation in Jackson county.

Traverse City—A strenuous effort is being made by Traverse City to land the 1918 state convention of Sunday schools. Delegates will be sent to the Detroit convention this year with a special invitation to the convention to come here.

Petoskey—Large shipments of sheep are coming from the west and consigned to Wolverine and the surrounding district. Ten thousand of the yearlings have already been carried across the straits and 90,000 more are to follow, coming in 3,000 lots.

Hastings—Richard Slater, twenty-two years old, of Charlotte, who was arrested in Grand Rapids charged with stealing an auto belonging to Wilson Lake of Freepoint, waived examination in Justice Andrus' court here and was remanded for arraignment in Circuit court.

Portland—The oldest manufacturing building in Portland has been torn down and all that remains of the old wooden mill is stacked up in piles awaiting final disposition. The Portland Milling company purchased the building and the land on which it stands and sold the machinery for junk.

East Lansing—The farmer or the gardener who desires to raise a crop of potatoes but who has been unable to plant because of wet weather or for other reasons has time yet to put in his seed, according to M. A. C. potato specialists. Potatoes, they say, may safely be seeded as late as the middle of July.

Benton Harbor—Clayton McK. Deam of this city is the first local youth to receive a commission in the engineering department at Fort Sheridan. Mr. Deam has proved to be very skillful in his chosen profession and his efficiency enabled him to quickly qualify for a commission in the engineering corps.

BAIRD FORMALLY NAMED WARDEN

STATE WILL TAKE OVER NORTH-
ERN FOREST FIRE FIGHTING
SQUAD; GREATER EFFI-
CIENCY PLANNED.

Lansing—John Baird of Saginaw was formally elected state game, fish and forestry warden to succeed William R. Oates at Friday's meeting of the public domain commission. David Jones of Petoskey succeeds Baird as chief deputy and Frank K. Wyman of Munising, who is a new appointee, succeeds Jones as assistant chief deputy. Baird has been acting game warden since Oates resigned a few weeks ago to accept a position with the securities commission.

A large increase in the forest fire fighting arrangements for the state is forecast by the action of the commission in taking over the fire fighting organization of the northern forest protective association. This association, in existence for six years, consisting of a trained woods force with headquarters at Marquette, is now merged with the state fire warden's department.

MAN ARRESTED CHARGED WITH SMUGGLING CHINESE

Detroit—Frank West, fifty years old, wanted on a charge of smuggling Chinese across the Detroit river from Canada, was arrested by federal immigration authorities here. After a roundup of alleged smugglers taken with several Chinese some years ago in Lansing West was indicted by a grand jury. He had been sought by federal authorities for eight years.

PLANK BREAKS NECK OF GRANT PIONEER

Grant—Winfield Parrish, sixty-eight, pioneer resident of Ashland township, was almost instantly killed Friday afternoon when struck by a timber falling from the barn of John McKinley near here. Mr. Parrish was walking near the barn, where some carpenters were making some repairs, and a heavy plank fell and broke his neck. No relatives survive him.

FIND 156 PREHISTORIC SPEARHEADS IN MOUND

Coopersville—A few days ago 156 Indian spearheads were unearthed on the Ketchpaw farm near Lamont. Curator H. E. Sargent of the Kent Scientific museum was notified of the find and he made an examination, stating they were a supply evidently stored there by the maker of arrow heads of a prehistoric tribe. He is coming here soon to dig in the mound where they were found.

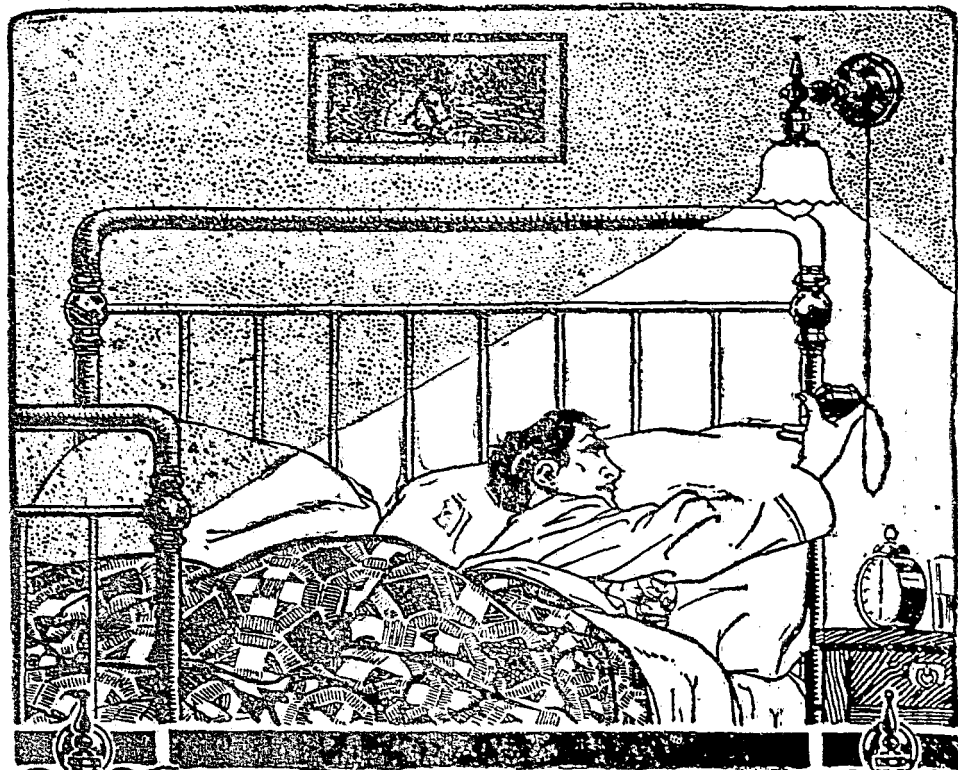

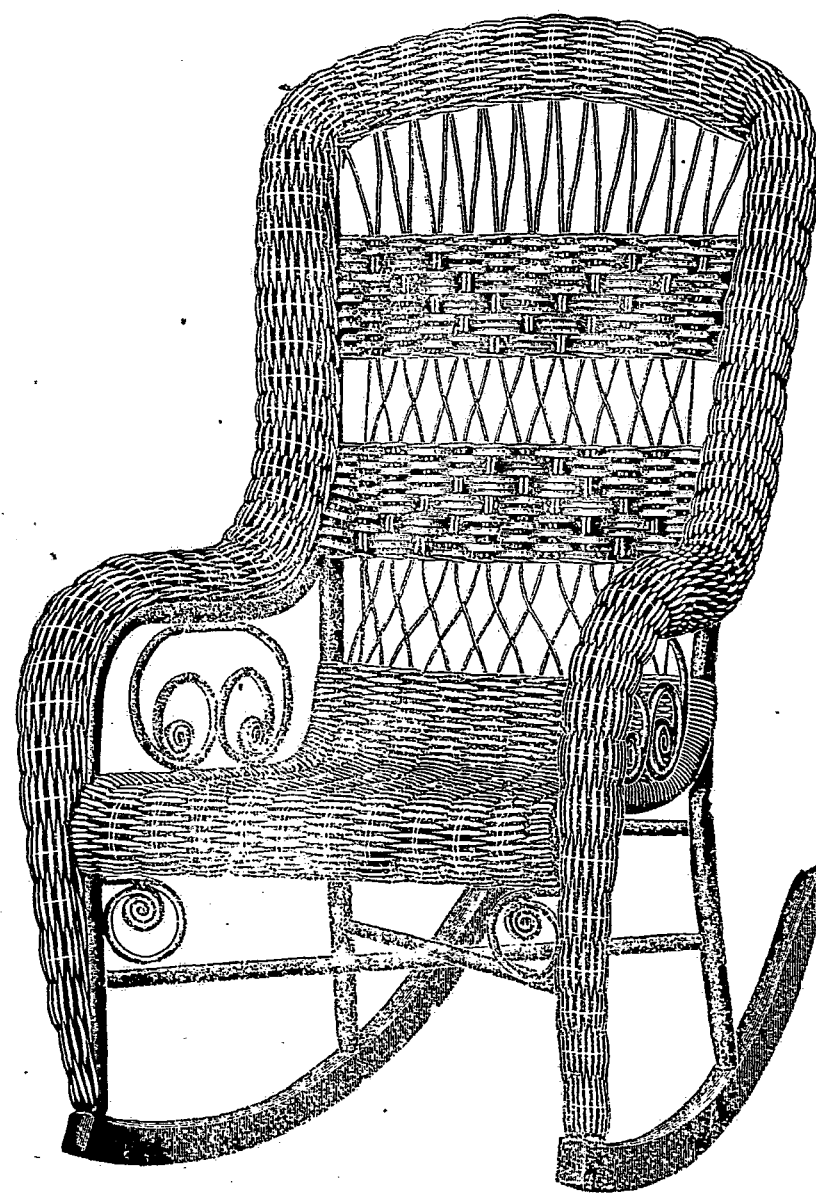
