AN ORDINANCE to further regulate the use of motor vehicles in the village of Buchanan, Berrien County, Michigan.

The village of Buchanan Ordains:

1. That it shall hereafter be unlaw-

ful for any person under the influence of intoxicating liquor, or any exhilarating or stupefying drug, to drive, operate or have charge of the power of any automobile, motor-cycle or other motor vehicle upon any public street, alley, avenue, driveway or any other public place within the corporate limits of the village of Buchanan. It shall also be unlawful for the owner of any motor vehicle, or any person having such vehicle in charge or in control thereof, to authorize or knowingly permit the same to be driven upon any public highway, street, avenue, driveway, alley or other public place within said village, by any person who is under the influence of any intoxicating liquor, or of any exhilarating or stupefying drug.

2. Any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be liable to a fine of not less than One Hundred Dollars or to imprisonment in county jail for a term not to exceed ninety days or both such fine and im-
