in the registration book.

Registration of Absence by Oath Sec. 9.

If any person whose name is not registered shall offer and claim the right to vote at any election or pri-mary election, and shall, UNDER OATH, state that he or she is a resident of the precinct and has resided in the VILLAGE TWENTY DAYS next preceding such election or primary election, designating particularly the place of his or her residence and that he or she possess the other qualifications of an elector under the constitution; and that owing to the sickness or bodily infirmity of himself or herself or some member of his or her family, or owing to his or her absence from the VILLAGE on public business or his or her own business, and without intent to avoid or delay his or her registration, he or she was unable to make application for registration on the last day provided by law for the registering of electors preceding such election or primary election, then the name of such person shall be registered, and he or she shall then be permitted to vote at such election or primary election. If such applicant shall in said matter, wilfully make any false rtatement, he or she shall be deemed guilty of periury, and upon conviction, be subject to the pains and nenalties thereof.
