

# VILLAGE ELECTION !

Notice is hereby given to the qualified electors of the village of Buchanan, State of Michigan, that the next ensuing annual village election will be held at the Engine house on south Oak St., within said village on Monday, March 8, 1926, at which election the following village officers are to be elected, viz:

1 Village President; 1 Village Clerk; 1 Village Treasurer; also 3 Trustees for 2 years; 1 Assessor.

Relative to opening and closing of the polls:

Sec. 1. On the day of any election the polls shall be opened at seven o'clock in the forenoon, or as soon thereafter as may be, and shall be continued open until five o'clock in the afternoon and no longer;

The polls of said election will be open at 7 o'clock A. M. and will remain open until 5 o'clock P. M. of said day of said election.

Notice is hereby given that at said general election to be held on Monday, March 8, 1926, the electors of said village of Buchanan will vote upon the question of bonding the village for the sum of twenty thousand dollars in accordance with the following resolution:

Resolved by trustee Bristol and supported by trustee Sands That it is Public Necessity that the village of Buchanan acquire title to the lands of William F. Bainton, upon which it now holds an option and it is further resolved that sufficient money to obtain said title cannot be raised by the council, except by the issuance of bonds of said village.

THEREFORE it is further resolved that the question of issuing bonds of said village in the amount of \$20,-

000.00 to obtain sufficient money to finish paying William F. Bainton for said property be submitted to the electors of the said village of Buchanan, at the next general election to be held at the ENGINE HOUSE in said village of Buchanan on Monday the eighth day of March, 1926, Said bonds to be in denominations of \$500.00 each and to bear interest at the rate of five percent per annum, payable semi-annually on the 1st day of June and December of each year until said bonds are fully paid, Said bonds to mature as follows,— \$5,000.00 on December 1st, 1926; \$5,000.00 on December 1st, 1927; \$5,000.00 on December 1st, 1928; and \$5,000.00 on December 1st, 1929. It is further resolved that the form of the ballot to be used for the purpose of submitting said question to the electors shall be as follows,—

Shall the village of Buchanan issue bonds in the amount of \$20,000.00 for the purpose of paying William F. Bainton the balance of the purchase price of lands now held by the village of Buchanan under a certain contract between the said village and the said William F. Bainton, dated October 1st, 1925.
