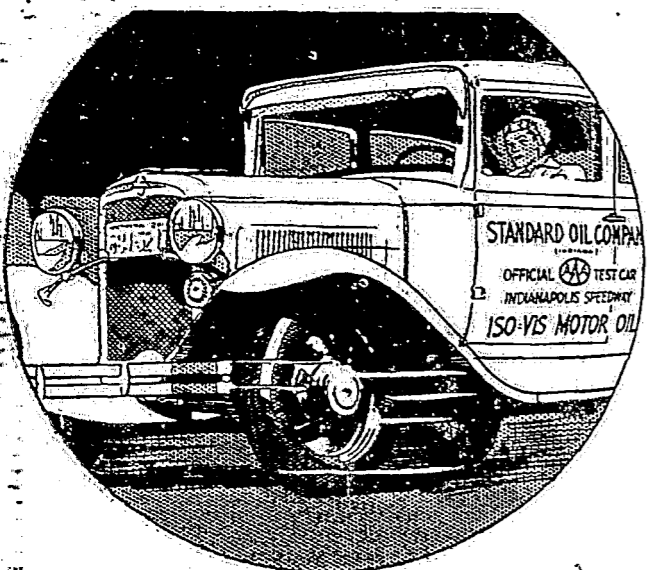

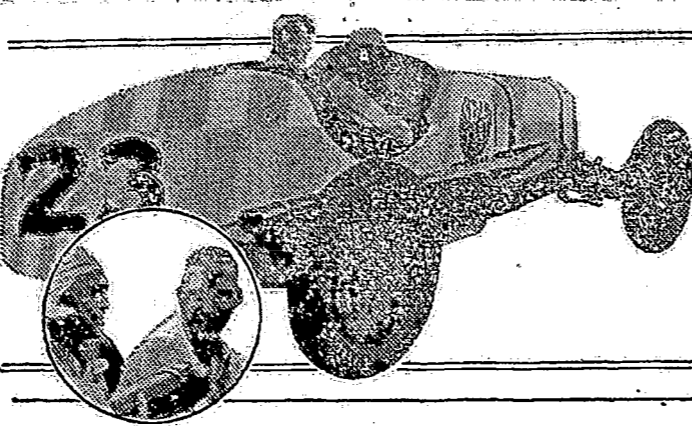

October, teeth; November and December, foods, etc. Posters, talks, stories, booklets, songs, poems and health plays are used by the teachers and the nurse to make it more interesting. Extra time was put on foods this year because of the hard times. We tried to teach the value of cereals, vegetables and milk, the least expensive and most valuable of foods.

Many out grown pairs of shoes and rubbers and many articles of children's clothing were sent for unfortunate ones during the winter. This was all distributed. Besides this the following clothing was purchased: 25 pairs children's shoes, \$54.25; 22 pairs rubbers and galoshes, \$47.70; 3 over coats for boys, \$17.02; 7 shirts, \$3.37; 5 suits of underwear, \$4.90; 1 pair mittens, 40c; cap, 50c; 15 pair stockings, \$9.66; 1 child sent to dentist, \$1. A committee of the parent-teachers association approved these bills.

This year morning health inspection was conducted by the teachers daily. Those who were dirty were sent to clean up. Those with sores, rashes and severe colds, were sent to the nurse. From a daily report this average list has been taken.

One case of impetigo on the face, dressed and instructions given for caring for it at home; 1 poisoned arm, bandaged and advised to see a doctor; 2 sore throats swabbed, 1 with pink eye sent home, 1 burned arm dressed, 1 with itch, sulphur ointment applied, arm bandaged directions sent home; 1 with sore throat, cold compresses applied, 1 cut finger dressed, 1 skinned knee dressed.

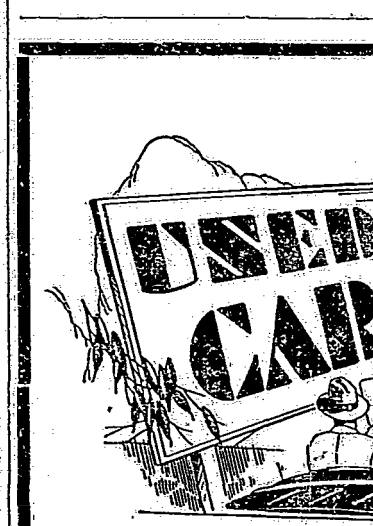
