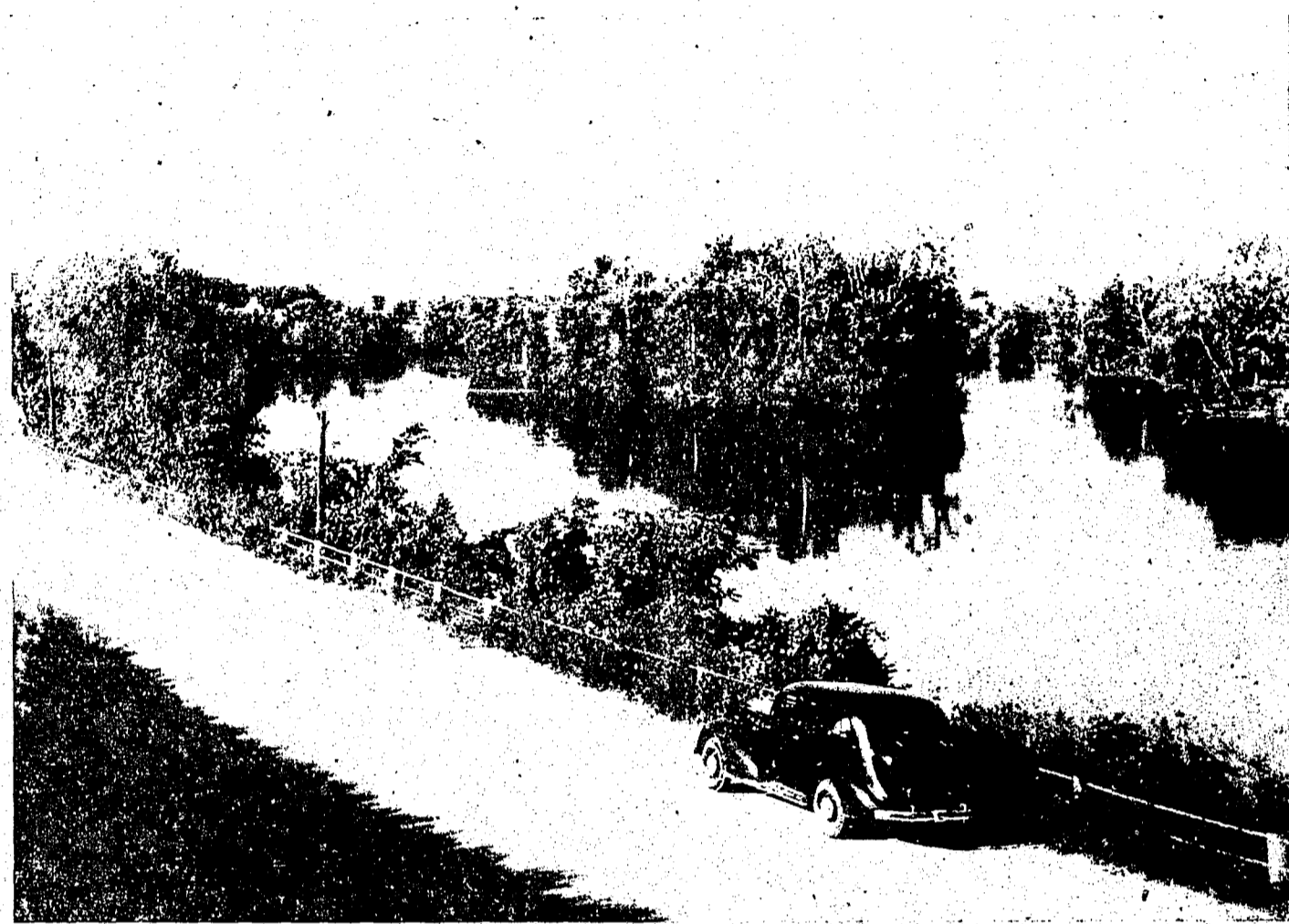

A couple of years ago the writer was in a town to the north of Buchanan and praised the appearance of the place to a woman resident...

It is a fact that Buchanan averages above other towns in the district in appearance, but this superiority comes almost entirely from natural advantages...

Attractive as these approaches are, they are capable

of much improvement. Best known is the Redbud Trail to the north. Three years ago 150 Redbud trees were planted along the Moccasin bluff grade...

Lester Mitchell planted two large Redbuds on the east end his residence lot on Roe street, next to the millrace the fall after the trees were planted on the trail...

It is not too late to plant Redbuds this spring. In fact there are still nearly two weeks of seasonable planting left. Trees of good size can be secured for nothing...

The Redbud idea has the advantage that, properly planted, the trees take care of themselves, without maintenance expense.

It has been suggested that Buchanan should have a long range parking program, planned 10 to 25 years ahead, so that a cumulative schedule of improvement might be carried out such as would tend to become permanent scenic additions.

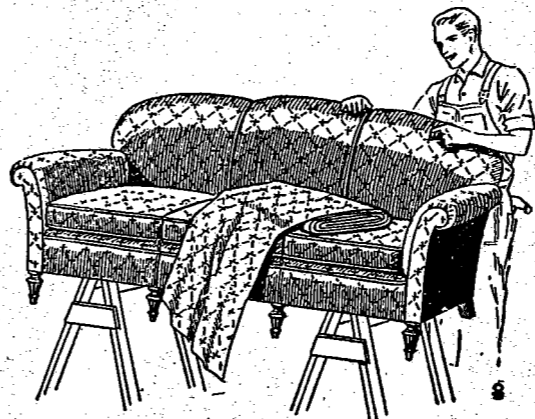

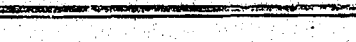
