

2015 Adult Craft Schedule

Jan. 16 **Clothbound notepads:** We will be creating the fabric covered covers for Post-It notepads. The 3" square notepads are the perfect size for a purse or glove box. Beads will be available if you wish to embellish your notepad.

Feb. 20 **Felted wool mug rug:** Felted wool is a wonderful material that doesn't ravel and is easy to embellish with applique and embroidery. We will be learning basic wool applique and a few simple embroidery stitches to make your mug rug special.

March 20 **Silk flower fairies:** Anyone can make a sweet little fairy with a bit of wire, a bead and a silk flower or two. Once you learn the basic technique you can make your fairy as fancy as you like.

April 17 **Decorated flower pots:** Henna patterns are traditionally used to adorn the body but we are going to use them on a terra cotta flowerpot. Use your decorated pot for a lucky plant or for holding pencils.

May 15 **Cat toys:** Make your favorite cat toys from recycled materials and a pouch or two made with organic catnip.

June 19 **Bottle necklace:** A small corked bottle, suspended by beads and ribbon, is the focal piece of a fun summer necklace. You decide what treasures to put inside.

July 17 **Polymer clay mushrooms:** Polymer clay is super simple to shape and is hardened in an oven. We will be making simple mushrooms that will be used in next month's fairy garden.

August 21 **Fairy garden:** This is a small fairy garden to keep inside. We will be using small natural items to give each garden its own personality.

Sept. 18 **Miniature Indian corn:** Ears of miniature corn grow in beautiful colors. They will form the background for an autumn arrangement of flowers and leaves that can be hung or laid flat, as you wish.

October 16 **Bead and wire snowflakes:** These delicate pieces can be used for tree ornaments, light catchers or even in jewelry. We will start with a simple pattern, but once you learn the basics, the variations are endless.

Nov. 20 **Winter in a wine glass:** We will be making a winter scene in a wine glass using nostalgic bottlebrush tree and a little polymer clay snowman.

Dec. 11 **Fresh greens arrangement:** Mixed fresh greens, silk flowers and natural accents will be provided to make a long lasting holiday arrangement in a waterproof container.
